THE MOSSBACK OCTOPUS AT ALBANY

This animal that inhabits certain portion of the Willamette valley dies a slow death at Albany.

But there are indications that the death and burial of this megalothumpus WILL TAKE PLACE SOON UP THERE.

It was given a rude shock when a lot of the young business men built an opera house a few years ago.

It was done without the consent of the megalothumpus hosts, who had an old hall that was "GOOD ENOUGH FOR ALBANY."

But the opera house has paid 8 per cent on the investment.

The next step was the erection of the ELKS HALL AND SOLID BUSINESS BLOCK on corner First and Lyon streets.

The new block will have an income of \$2400 from rents and \$5000 from lodge dues.

Popular loan bonds were floated at 6 per cent with no trouble whatever and WITHOUT THE AWFUL SANCTION OF THE BIG FINANCIERS.

The Southern Pacific has surprised itself by erecting a fine new passenger depot, which the town will soon outgrow.

THE MOSSBACK OCTOPUS HAS BEEN ABLE TO PREVENT STREET PAVING AND AN ELECTRIC STREETCAR LINE FOR SEVERAL YEARS.

It is still in the saddle digging its spurs into the ribs of the community but will be unhorsed at the next meeting of the city council.

The city of Albany has some of the greatest advantages of any city in the Willamette valley.

It is the crossing point of two railroad systems and has A GREAT MANY SMALL AND FLOURISHING INDUSTRIES.

It is surrounded by a fertile grain, dairy and fruit growing region and has a wide-awake prosperous population.

But the megalothumpus have BEEN ABLE TO BLOCK AND SCARE THE LIFE OUT OF ONE PROGRESSIVE ENTERPRISE AFTER ANOTHER.

But the mossback octopus that has held down this beautiful valley city has its ticket bought and its baggage checked for oblivion where it belongs.

FIRST USE OF THE RECALL IN OREGON

A case has been made up in Lincoln county which will constitute the first use of the recall in Oregon.

The circumstances seem to be as follows: The county court LET A CONTRACT TO BUILD A PIECE OF HIGHWAY to James Kent of Waldport.

The work was to cost \$400, was done and was accepted on the part of the county by Commissioner Fogarty and paid for.

The road supervisor found that the road instead of being eight feet wide in certain dangerous place WAS ONLY SIX AND A HALF TO SEVEN FEET WIDE.

One William F. Keady presented affidavits from reputable witnesses to this effect and filed a petition for the recall.

Several road supervisors condemn the new road as a "half-pitch trail" THAT SHOULD NOT BE ACCEPTED BY THE COUNTY.

It is claimed by Commissioner Fogarty's defenders that he is the victim of a political conspiracy.

The Newport Mail charges that Keady wanted the nomination for commissioner, AND WANTS TO GET EVEN WITH FOGARTY.

It is charged that it is a conspiracy to turn Lincoln county over to Bryan, and says people will vote for Bryan rather than see Fogarty made the victim of the recall.

It would seem to be plainly a question of facts. The contract called for a highway "WITH A GOOD SOLID EIGHT-FOOT ROADBED."

County Commissioner Fogarty accepted a road that by the showing of the witnesses was only six and a half to seven feet wide in places.

The county paid for an eight-foot road bed, and got one THAT WAS NOT UP TO THE SPECIFICATIONS.

If Mr. Fogarty did what he is accused of he has certainly made a mistake, and may be the first victim of the recall.

IF POLITICS AND SPITEWORK ENTER INTO THE MATTER, as is charged, the people of Lincoln county may see through it and may not recall him.

County governments are a matter of business administration and THE COMMISSIONER IS AN HONEST MAN AND MAY HAVE MADE A MISTAKE.

The Capital Journal would not like to see the law abused on the first trial and hopes that the matter may be sifted.

DIPHTHERIA BREAKS OUT AROUND COOS BAY

Marshfield, Or., Oct. 10.—Several cases of diphtheria have been discovered on Coos Bay, four cases alone having been reported in Marshfield. One man, brought here from Prosper died the day after he was taken sick. Dr. Mingus, the city health officer, says there is no cause for alarm in Marshfield, but that those cases which have developed have been of an extremely malignant type.

Some alarm is felt in Curry county. It is likely that Gold Beach

will be placed under quarantine and that two special health officers will be appointed to assist the sheriff in the health department work.
