REPUBLICAN DOCTRINE OF PROTECTION

(From Taft's Letter of Acceptance.) The Republican doctrine of protection, as definitely announced by the Republican convention of this and by previous conventions, is that a tariff shall be imposed on all imported products, whether of the factory, farm or mine, sufficiently great to equal the difference between the cost of production abroad and at home, and that this difference should, of course, include the difference between the higher wages paid in this country and the wages paid abroad, and embrace a reasonable profit to the American producer. A system of protection thus adopted and put in force has led to the establishment of a rate of wages here that has greatly enhanced the standard of living of the laboring man. It is the policy of the Republican party permanently to continue that standard of living. In 1897 the Dingley tariff bill was passed, under which we have had, as already said, a period of enormous prosperity.

The consequent material development has greatly changed the conditions under which many articles described by the schedules of the tariff are now produced. The tariff in a number of the schedules exceeds the difference between the cost of production of such articles abroad and at home, including a reasonable profit to the American producer. The excess over that difference serves no useful purpose, but offers a temptation to those who would monopolize the production and the sale of such articles in this country, to profit by the excessive rate. On the other hand, there are other schedules in which the tariff is not sufficiently high to give the measure of protection which they should receive upon Republican principles, and as to those the tariff should be raised. A revision of the tariff undertaken upon this principle, which is at the basis of our present business system, began promptly upon the incoming of the new administration, and considered at a special session with the preliminary investigations already begun by the appropriate committees of the house and senate, will make the disturbance of business incident to such a change as little as possible.

NEW OFFICIAL DIRECTORY

Twenty-two of the 34 counties in the state have gone dry and but 12 remain wet, according to the returns collected by Secretary of State Benson from the general election of last June and just issued in the new official directory. Of the counties included in the wet list is Baker, Clatsop and Multnomah, prohibition was not voted on as a whole in these counties, and Crook, Curry, Gilliam and Wallowa voted dry either at the 1906 or 1908 election. The dry counties are Crook, Gilliam, Wallowa, Benton, Douglas, Grant, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, Lane, Linn, Malheur, Morrow, Polk, Sherman, Tillamook, Umatilla, Union, Wheeler and Yamhill. The wet counties are Baker, Multnomah, Clackamas, Columbia, Coos, Harney, Lake, Lincoln (by three votes), Marion, Wasco and Washington. No vote was taken on prohibition in the newly created county of Hood River. Other interesting political data contained in the directory is a tabulated statement of the abstract of votes cast. The total ballot at the 1908 election was 166,164 as against 99,445 in 1906 and 99,315 in 1904. The population of the state, according to the state census of 1905, was 464,538 as compared with the federal census of 1900, which gave a total of 413,536. The total registration for the June election, 1908, from January 1 to May 15, was 122,095 and this was distributed among the several political parties, as follows: Republicans, 80, 921; Democrats, 28,788; Prohibition, 1889; Socialist, 3226; Populists, 59; Independents, 3656, and there were 3556 who registered and refused to designate political party.

There are now 660 pupils enrolled in the Corvallis public schools, being over 200 more than at the corresponding period of last year and the registration still goes merrily on. There are 68 in the high school and 90 in the 8th grade, all of whom should graduate this year.

At the present rate of increase there will be from 150 to 200 high school students to be taken care of next year and our people might as well commence thinking about it right now as to what they are going to do about it. Every room will be crowded to its full capacity and with the Roosevelt policies still in vogue another school room is an absolute necessity. Our people have met every obligation placed upon them and we welcome all the bright, happy little children who care to come, with us in search of an education and a home.
