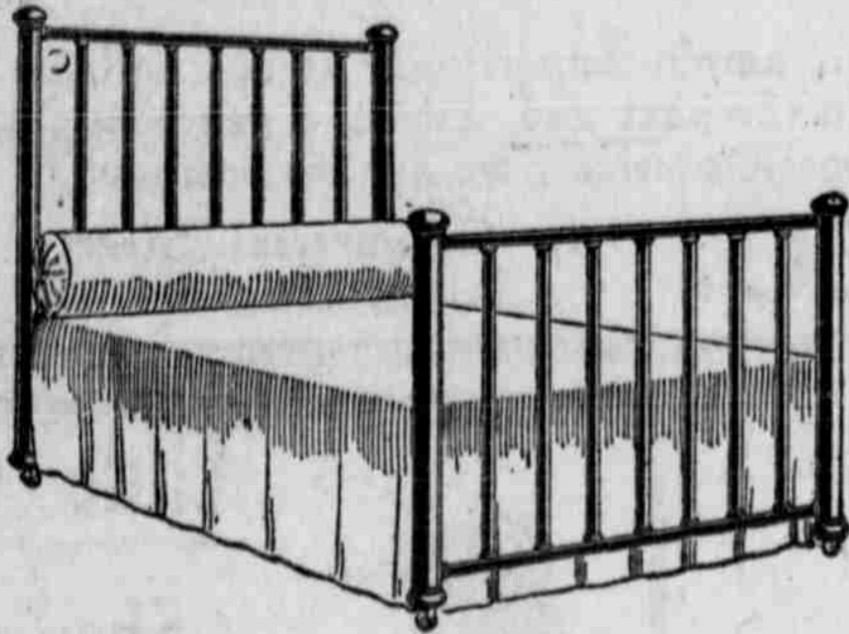

CAMPAIGN ON HOME STRETCH

Morrow, Ohio, Oct. 12.—Taft today began his most strenuous tour of the campaign when he addressed the farmers here in the opening speech of a trip that will take him three days through the rural districts of Ohio, three days in the south, next Sunday in New Jersey and Maryland, three days in Indiana, a week in New York and a closing speech in Youngstown, Ohio, the night before the election.

The Taft special left Cincinnati at 7 o'clock today with Senator William Alden Smith of Michigan as an assistant speech-maker to the Republican candidate.

The first stop was made here where several hundred farmers gave the Republican nominee an enthusiastic

welcome. Taft was in good voice.

The special train is scheduled to make 16 stops today and end at Akron, where Taft is to be principal speaker at a demonstration tonight.

CANDIDATE FAVORS WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE

At Sabina Taft was greeted by a large delegation of school children and in his address to them, gave an expression indicating that he favors women's suffrage. He said:

"You may not vote this ticket this time, but the time will come when you will and when that time comes, I hope the girls will vote too."

Senator Smith followed Taft and in his remarks referred to the activity of boys under 14 years of age in the civil world.

Lincoln, Neb., Oct. 12.—Before several hundred students on the campus of the University of Nebraska today, William Jennings Bryan appealed to the first voters of the country, declaring that the Democratic party is the party of the people. He was loudly cheered by the students and was given a rousing "three times three" when he concluded.

Bryan will leave here tomorrow on a tour of Nebraska and the eastern slope of the Rocky mountains. He spent today inspecting the list of contributions to the campaign fund, which was submitted to him by the national committee for his approval.

JAPAN TO EUROPE DIRECT BY RAIL

Tokio, Oct. 12.—Japan and Russia have agreed to join the two countries by a traffic arrangement between the Siberia and East China railway, the South Manchurian Railway, the Home Inland Imperial Railway, and the Osaka Steamship Company's lines.

This agreement will permit of a continuous trip from Japan to Europe.

FOR FIGHTING THE BACTERIAL DISEASES

An important step forward in the prevention of bacterial diseases is due to the recent studies of Professor Uhlenhuth and Dr. Xylander, as just recorded in the Klinische Wochenschrift of Chemnitz, Germany, and which he reviews:

These investigators find that remarkably successful results in the field in question are obtained by the use of antiformin. This is a trade name given to the alkaline liquid prepared by the addition of caustic soda to the familiar solution of sodium hypochlorite, known as Eau de Javene, and used for years as a bleaching agent, for the removal of ink and fruit stains and for moistening surgical bandages.

Antiformin is encountered in commerce as a clear, yellow liquid, with a strong but not repulsive odor, suggestive of both chlorine and caustic alkali. On account of the impossibility of isolating alkaline hypochlorites, solutions only can be prepared and used. For some time past antiformin has been used as a disinfectant, and especially in breweries for the purpose of cleansing rapidly and thoroughly vats and pipes.

The experiments of the two professors establish the fact that this compound destroys most effectively and rapidly the bacteria of dysentery, cholera, typhoid fever, diphtheria and the bubonic plague. These germs are killed when brought in contact for a few minutes with 5 per cent and even weaker solutions of antiformin. When a comparatively small amount of the powerful reagent is added to water containing the germs in question they gradually disappear; enter, in fact, into solution, very much as a lump of sugar would under similar conditions.

This property of antiformin renders it admirably adapted for the purification from bacteria of potable water, and for the complete disinfection of sewage and excrementitious matter. Experiments with the latter show that not only are all pathological germs present completely destroyed, but that also every trace of odor is removed.

Strange to say, the bacteria of tuberculosis show a remarkable power of resistance against the action of antiformin, so much so that it evidently will be of little aid in connection with the world-wide crusade now being waged against that disease. There are, however, many indications that antiformin will be of pronounced value in connection with the developments in the rapidly widening field of serumtherapy.

MARSHFIELD FLOATING BIG BOND ISSUE

The Marshfield city council Wednesday evening ordered the sale of about \$16,000 worth of special improvement bonds to pay for several street improvements that have recently been made. The bonds are to be issued under what is known as the Eddy bonding act. The bonds are issued on application of various property owners liable for portions for the costs of the various improvements and are really a first mortgage against the property on which they are issued. They bear interest at 6 per cent and are issued for a term of ten years, being paid off on the partial payment plan. The bonds will be dated November 1, but it is expected that they will be sold prior to that date.

The ordinance providing for their sale specifies that they shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest and that any premium paid for them shall be turned into the general fund of the city. As soon as the bonds are sold, the contractors on the various jobs will be paid in full for their work.
