## SHEEP TO REPLAC GATTLE

Short range, due to the unparalleled drouth of the present year, has changed the Butter creek and Umatilla Meadows country in the west end of the county from a cattle feeding to a sheep feeding district during the present season. Only about one-third the number of cattle fed by the farmers of that district last year will be wintered the present season, while between 50,000 and 60,000 sheep will be wintered where last year there was only about 10,000 head.

Of the 50,000 sheep which have been driven in from the foothill ranges between 5000 and 6000 are being fed for mutton. The other are stock sheep.

From the Asa Thomson ranch on upper Butter creek every ton of hay raised this year will be fed to sheep—something that has not occurred for years. Lower down cattle will be fed. The Minor company, which is one of the heaviest sheep feeders, will also winter about 1000 cattle, being the largest feeder of beef. Joe Saylor will feed about 300 head, Bob Stanfield 500, Jesse Moore 200, the Umatilla Ranch 500, Fred Andrews 250, Joe Cunha 200 and G. P. Higginbottom 200 head.

Asa Thomson, who is authority for the above estimates, says that while the hay crop was short this season that the Butter creek feeders will in a measure make up for the deficiency in profitable feeding.

That prohibiting the sale of adulterated candy.

That prohibiting the sale of trout.

The act declaring void all marriages of white and mixed blood.

That making the sale of liquors near mines unlawful.

That prohibiting persons under 15 years from smoking in public.

## ROSEBURG

Conventions will be held in Roseburg Friday and Saturday, October 23 and 24.

A number of prominent speakers are present from various parts of the state.

A general good roads meeting will be held in connection with the session of the legislature, and every road supervisor and every good roads advocate in the county is expected to be present.

In pursuance of this matter, active measures are now being taken to make the largest possible meeting ever held in southern Oregon.

The executive committee, composed of Gov. Chamberlain, Supt. Ackerman and E. Hofer, held a meeting at 9 a. m. and audited all bills to date, and formulated a plan to make the normal schools self-sustaining.

**ALBANY.** Willie Dickenson, who lives on the Santiam, was driving to town early Saturday morning when he saw a deer eating peacefully in a nearby field. He secured a gun at once and killed the deer. This was about four miles east of Albany.

"G" company, O. N. G., began practice on the new rifle range this morning for the first time, and it is expected the boys will keep it lively around there for a while.

The fifty-fifth anniversary of the First United Presbyterian church in the world was held in Albany yesterday. The building in which this church was formed in Albany, still stands.

Four grading camps have been established and work is being rushed on the California-Northwestern road to Klamath Falls.

Some of the features to be considered will be good roads in general, an automobile road from Roseburg to Coos Bay, and perhaps the matter of a railroad from Idaho, to Coos Bay. Development of the fruit industry, dairy, stock, poultry, diversified farming, lumbering and numerous industries will very probably be included among the matters un-

der discussion. Musical and other features will also be included in the two days' program.

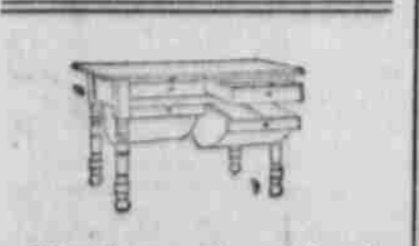

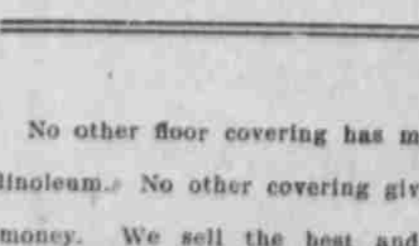
