JOHN BURNS AND
HIS ELECTRIC TRAMCAR
Shortly after his marriage, which
took place in 4880, John Burns, the
British labor leader, settled down as
a journeyman engineer in Battersea,
and not long ago confessed that he
was the first engineer to make with
his own hands the first electric tram-

his own hands the first electric tram-car in this country.

In those days, however, people did not believe that electric traction was possible, and Burns had to take the dyname and tram to the Crystal Pal-ace and run the latter round the grounds for six months before peo-ple could be induced to believe in the novelty. the novelty.

But the people were so nervous that, although the charge was only sixpence, none of them would ven-ture in the new-fangled invention. Then Burns was strack with a brilliant idea. He said to his wife:

You have got to come down to the palace three times a week and get into the first electric tramcar as a decoy duck for the others."

This was only temporarily successful. So Burn brought along his mother-in-law, "and," said the prest-dent of the local government board when relating the incident, "when a husband, a wife and a mother-in-law co-operate success is assured."-Tit-Bits.
