**SWINBURNE TO GET THE NOBEL PRIZE**

It is announced that the Nobel prize of \$100,000, which is annually awarded to "the person who in literature has provided the most excellent work of an idealistic tendency," is to be bestowed this year upon Charles Swinburne, the distinguished author of "Laus Veneris," "Songs Before Sunrise" and other more or less well known poems.

It is some respects this is a surprising selection. That Swinburne is a "standing in the literary world which entitles him to be thus honored will not be seriously or intelligently disputed. To say that he is the most eminent of living English poets is not saying very much, for he has risen to fill the places left by the disappearance of the great poets of which Swinburne is the last survivor.

**STATE UNIVERSITY GREATLY IMPROVED**

A new bulletin of the correspondence-study department of the University of Oregon has just been received. The scope of the work has been greatly enlarged over the bulletin made last year, and now covers courses in English, classics, Shakespeare, pedagogy, botany, history, algebra, geometry, trigonometry, analytic geometry, and several courses in mathematics for teachers. By means of this work any student who has not time to attend college or high school, can pursue, with hardly any cost, practically the same work by correspondence through the University courses, and receive credit for it. Thousands of dollars each year are sent out of Oregon to various correspondence schools, and the University believes that a large part of this might just as well be saved

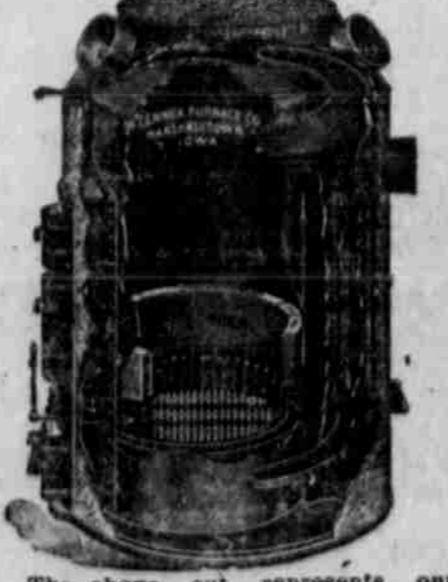
