BROWNELL GETS FURTHER VINDICATION

Attorney George C. Brownell of Oregon City is in receipt of a letter from Hon. Thomas B. Neuhausen, special inspector of the interior department, that comes unadvised, further exonerating Mr. Brownell from any blame in the Oregon land frauds.

My Dear Sir:—It is with great pleasure that I write you to say as a matter of justice to you, that during my connection with the department of the interior a special inspector of the interior department at Portland, Oregon, I had occasion, together with other members of the government service, to make a thorough investigation of the charges that had been made by several individuals including political enemies, of your alleged connection with what has been commonly known as the Oregon land frauds, and after having made a most thorough investigation, I, as well as other representatives of the government, became thoroughly convinced that you are innocent of any violation of the land laws, and in no way connected with or involved in the Oregon land frauds.
