There are places in many counties where walnuts do exceptionally well and while they have not so far received a very large amount of attention in the state, it is only a question of a few years, when they will be extensively raised.

DANGER IN BRINGING SHEEP FROM MOUNTAINS

As this is the date for bringing sheep out of the mountains and government reserves there are a great many problems which the sheep men will have to face in the drives. According to Dr. W. H. Lytle, state sheep inspector, the date has recently passed for the removal of flocks from the reserves and, that, together with the approach of cold weather is causing a general movement of sheep from the mountains to the foothills to private ranches.

In trailing, sheep are subjected to a great many dangers. The flocks that go over the road first will eat off all the grass and those that come after will be subject to danger from poison roots. The recent rains will minimize this danger somewhat.

The most general danger, however, according to Dr. Lytle, to which sheep are subjected in trailing, is the danger from eating too much alkali. Sheep men in this section may best be warned and advised by reading the experiences of sheep men of the Arlington district.

In Arlington, Dr. Lytle says, that there has been heavy losses of sheep this season in trailing. The most general cause of the loss has been alkali poisoning. In many instances sheep were trailed for 250 miles through dry country where it was oftentimes necessary for them to go two days or more without water. In addition to this the drivers neglected to give the sheep enough salt. As a result they licked an alkali whenever they found it along the road.

These two things, lack of sufficient water, and of plenty of salt are most often the cause of alkali poisoning. The symptoms are: bloated, followed by scours; usually froth and deposit of alkali like salt round mouth and nostrils.

A great many sheep in the Arlington district have been saved by treatment after getting poison. The best general treatments are, preventing animals from drinking excess of alkali water; if bloated puncture with a knife. Give raw oil.
