## RAILROAD COMMISSION RECEIVES COMPLAINT

Two communications was received by the railroad commissioners yesterday, one complaining of the scanty provisions made for the Cove Orchard station on the west side road, and the other requesting the commission to remedy the rates on minimum weights of cars.

The residents of Cove Orchard are represented by Roy Brenner, who informs the commission of the Southern Pacific's neglect to furnish reasonable quarters for passengers and freight which arrive and depart from that place every day. Brenner states the company has been notified as to the conditions of the facilities at that place, but no attention has been paid to the requests. The commission has advised Mr. O'Brien of the circumstances and investigation will be commenced at once.

From the other letter received by the commission from Allen & Buoy, it appears that the Southern Pacific company has been charging a minimum weight of 2,000 pound cars that would not hold a full shipment of shingles, and the correspondents wish the commission to look into the matter and get the rates in line with the transcontinental freight bureau system. The commission have written Allen & Buoy requesting a more exact explanation of the case in order that they may present same to the railroad officials without question.
