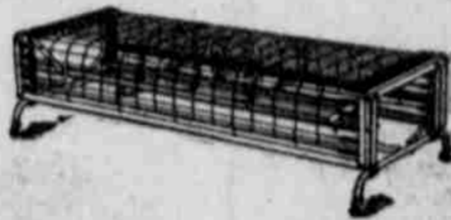

was hotly contested by Haupt in the Chadwick car, Robertson in a Locomobile, and Lytle driving the Isotta. The Chadwick forged ahead at the seventh lap but worked badly and at the next turn Robertson's Locomobile again took first place.

On the last turn Robertson was in the lead but ran off the track. He was able to regain his position and won by two minutes with Lytle in the Isotta car finishing second.

After the first two cars had finished, the crowd surged on the track in the path of the other machines. The drivers were compelled to stop to avoid injuring scores of persons. The race designated as the "motor parkway" was declared off. The time made by Robertson for the distance, 258.06 miles, was 6 hours 48 seconds. Lytle, 4 hours 2 minutes 36 2-5 seconds.
