pitality. He hoped the one from Coos Bay who had 500 miles to come forty ever have to come that way. It was a migration that to take a region was so far away.

Saturday Session.

The Oregon and Idaho Development congress, was addressed by Attorney General Crawford, with a review of the legislation leading up to the litigation over the Oregon and California land grant. He said the grant of the locks and canal at Oregon City was an analogous case, the state claiming that any grant of land or money to a quasi-public corporation, with powers of eminent domain, must comply with the terms of the grant and all the conditions thereof. It was a public trust held for a certain purpose in a certain way. Those conditions could not be changed or avoided by assignment. The beneficiary could not escape any condition that attended to the title of the act. In every grant of land to a public service corporation there was an implied contract to dispose of such lands according to the terms of the grant. The condition requiring sale at \$250 an acre to bona fide settlers becomes part of the grant.

Not even congress could waive the right to recover these lands in the event of failure to comply with the terms of the grant. No court had ever held to the contrary in a decision squarely affecting this case. Throwing open of the railroad grant to settlement would do a great deal to develop the state. General Crawford also touched upon the disposition of the waters of the state. The doctrine was growing up that the public had an interest in the disposition of the waters for productive crops.

People's Senator Popular.
Hon. Jonathan Bourne was given a very cordial reception at the Roseburg convention. It was his first appearance as a public speaker and he entirely overcame his diffidence before he had been on his feet ten minutes. His speech was not political but devoted entirely to explaining the proceedings to force the O. & C. railroad company to put their lands on the market at a fair price. Senator Bourne thought the development of the state absolutely required that these lands be opened to settlers.

Senator Bourne was introduced and received with great enthusiasm, as a man who had never made a political speech in his life, but who was present to answer questions touching his record or any public matter, and made an address of some length touching the disposition of the O. & C. land grant. Senator Bourne wanted an expression from the audience as to whether the people would be favorable to a change of policy, on the part of the railroad company to part with their lands suitable for settlement at a fair price for their land, or whether the litigation should proceed for a number of years, and then no disposition until final action by congress. It was developed that this latter plan would tie up the lands for many years, that in the event of the government winning the suit, the counties would lose the tax. Many of the audience expressed themselves pro and con, and Senator Bourne showed himself able to answer all questions.

Great Good Roads Speech.
Dr. Andrew C. Smith, president of the state board of health, made an extra fine good roads talk. He is an enthusiastic apostle of the good roads cause, and drew applause from his hearers many times by his appeal for a state highway from Portland to Ashland, that he estimated could be constructed, 300 miles from \$10,000 a mile, the state, the counties and the abutting property each to pay one-third.

Dr. Smith got a very cordial reception.

ception when he arose to speak for the cause of good roads. He said they were the greatest need of the state. People on the line of a railroad did not feel the need of good roads as much as those off the railroads. But those favored with railroads should not be selfish but should help those portions not so fortunate. A state road should be built from Portland to Ashland, and another main road east and west. The burden should be apportioned between the state, the counties and the abutting property, which would be immensely enhanced in value. The time was not far away when the nation government would assist in this cause.

He advocated co-operation with Coos Bay. If they could not build a high-class steam road, build an electric road. If not an electric road, build a first-class wagon road. Good roads were not local. They were a state wide necessity. A good highway from Roseburg to Myrtle Point would be 40 miles long and would be travelled in two hours with a good auto. He said one effect was arousing the people to a greater interest, acting together, doing away with apathy and conservatism that was so deadly in its effect on any community that had more than its share.

He made the point that aid from land highways was as necessary as for waterways. He showed that at first only interstate rivers were improved by the general government, but later waterways entirely within the state were granted aid for improvement. The sentiment was growing that state and national aid for public highways were appropriate and should be made. He hoped this convention would express itself strongly on this subject and pass resolutions asking that important public highways be built on a co-operative plan.

It was a self-evident fact that the better the highway the higher the value of property. It was an axiom that money spent on permanent roads was paid back every year. People would not move from a country with good roads to a country having poor roads. People do not move backwards. A poor farm on a good road was more profitable than a good farm on a bad road.

Judge Bean, of Lane county, presented the claims of Siuslaw harbor. He stated that the people demanded creation of a harbor district, where they could bond that district and tax themselves to improve their harbor. This plan provided creating an improvement district on petition and election to enable them to issue \$100,000 of bonds to enable them to develop their own harbor.
