LINN COUNTY HOGS DYING FROM CHOLERA

Hog cholera has made its appearance in the southern part of Linn county and south to Junction City, according to reports of farmers. The first instance was noted among hogs belonging to J. E. S. Neilson. He lost nine head. A few days later the herd of F. W. Thorn, who lives two miles from Mr. Neilson, contracted the disease, and 20 head were lost. At present the plague is ravaging the large band of fat hogs belonging to Hon. C. W. Washburn. To date he has lost 34 head and more are dying every day.

The state veterinary surgeon has been making an investigation and pronounces it to be cholera in its most violent form. He advised that all hogs having it should be killed and burned, which is now being done. It is not known how the disease gained a foothold as there has been no foreign breed brought in.

Sponge Industry in Yucatan.

The sponge bars lying along the coast and outlying islands off the eastern side of peninsula of Yucatan have never been extensively exploited up to the present time, or very recently; indeed, not at all, except by a few natives fishermen, known here as "skin divers." According to surveys recently made of the sponge beds, it is said that there is an abundance of high class sponges, particularly of the silk and sheep wool varieties, to be obtained in these waters, but the product of these native divers has never more than satisfied the local demand, and no attempt has, as far as can be learned, been made to develop an export trade in this article.

Recently, however, an American syndicate, made up of business men of New Orleans, has begun operations on the east coast, working under a concession granted to a resident of said city, and have brought here for this purpose experienced Greek divers and all necessary paraphernalia for going to depth of 15 fathoms (90 feet) or more for the sponges, and it is their intention that the exploitation shall be on a large scale.

The native divers are not in the habit of taking sponges from depths exceeding 15 feet or thereabout, and, considering that the better class of sponges are taken in the greater depths, it is reasonable to presume that, in the event of the enterprise being successfully carried through, Yucatan will before long be furnishing a considerable amount of fine sponges for the American markets.

EAST INDIANS IN THE TRANSVAAL

It is rather remarkable that in the Transvaal, both sides agree upon the main point which interests white population. The Transvaal is determined that only Asiatics who are entitled by previous residence to be in the colony shall cross the borders. Mr. Smuts has a distance mandate from the people to insist upon this and nothing less than this. The Transvaal has 354,000 Kaffirs to control. It has thousands of white people out of work. Therefore, it absolutely refuses to admit any more Asiatics, whether they are British subjects or not, whether educated or uneducated. It claims that charity must begin at home, that what work there is going to be done must be saved for the white people and not given to Asiatic strangers.

Mr. Gandhi says ditto to this. But when it comes to arranging the means by which a further infiltration of Asiatics shall be prevented, trouble arises. Mr. Gandhi will not accept Mr. Smuts's ideas. He denounces them as insulting to British subjects. He condemns them as class legislation of the worst type—the color type. He stands for the principle of the education test instead of the color test, even though in practice the principle may not be worth much.

Theoretically, academically, he is right; but the people of the Transvaal are not in the mood to discuss theories. In the first place, they say they must have protection, at all costs. In the second place, they declare that the law of the land must be enforced, and that successful passive resistance will have a bad influence upon the native population.

So the struggle goes on. Who will win it is impossible to say. Mr. Smuts failed to enforce the law last time, but this time he is confident that he can succeed. But the point at issue has been so narrowed down that it does not seem impossible to arrange a compromise. Yet I fear the struggle will go on to the bitter end. It is too late to come to an agreement—now. —London Daily Mail.

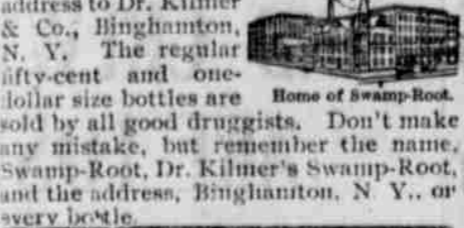
