

STEWART FIGHT IS NOT DEAD

ANS APPEAL TO CONGRESS

Washington, Nov. 2.—The retirement of Colonel William Stewart from the United States Army five years before the age limit brought powerful friends to the aid of the man who announced today that he would lay the matter before Congress at the next session. It is predicted that the hearing will result in the exposure of a personal feud as well as the Miles-Corbis animosity of the Fort Grant exile. Several distinct influences are working to bring Stewart back to the office with \$10,000 in pay, and the opportunity of retiring with higher pay and prestige.

Colonel Stewart, his wife and daughter have taken a residence in London, and will await the outcome of his fight for reinstatement.
