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INDEPENDENT NEWSPAPERS.

The fact that the out-and-out party organ, as a rule, is disappearing beneath the surface and that the independent or semi-independent newspaper is coming to the front, IS NOT GENERALLY DISPUTED IN THE WORLD OF NEWSPAPERS.

This seemingly is not due to any deterioration of the party organs. It is because public sentiment has changed considerably, and there are no great dividing lines between two leading political parties in the United States.

People generally nowadays appear to PREFER READING UN-COLORED NEWS. They seem to want all the news fit to print and both sides of all stories.

This, however, does not indicate that a newspaper should not be free to support the PARTY IT FAVORS. On the contrary, true independence means that the papers may praise or denounce the candidates of either party at will, while at the same time this need not, it is pointed out, prevent any periodical from being loyal either to the Republican or to the Democratic party.

There were periods in the past when a Republican paper could see things political ONLY THROUGH REPUBLICAN GLASSES and when a Democratic paper looked at political matters IN THE SAME MANNER.

But those days are gone and both Republicans and Democratic newspapers nowadays generally present fairly both sides of the party arguments advanced, thus giving their readers an opportunity TO WEIGH ALL THE ISSUES.

This is the most popular class of dependent newspapers as the "independent" newspapers of a certain grade IS MORE OF A "KNOCKER" THAN SOME PEOPLE LIKE.

Fair treatment of both sides of every question seems to be the best kind of independence.—The Fourth Estate.

PHILADELPHIA WAR GODS AROUSED

Military Metamorphosis of City of Brotherly Love.

Philadelphia is threatened with military metamorphosis. The Quaker stronghold is to be given over for the time being to the God of War and his armed hosts.

On Monday night Norman Hackett appears there at the Grand opera house in De Mille's big West Point drama, "Classmates," and the military gentleness of the town have decided to give the young star and his play such a welcome as the City of Brotherly Love has seldom witnessed.

All through the south Mr. Hackett has been treated to magnificent demonstrations by the military. In every city (and town of size) gentlemen in gold lace have occupied the boxes, and entire companies of soldiers have marched to their seats to file and drum. Philadelphia is the headquarters of the First Brigade, National Guard of Pennsylvania.

To further heighten the military atmosphere a huge brass cannon has been stationed in the theater lobby, where it will remain with its full complement of firing assistants ready for immediate engagement.
