## FORMER DALLAS MAN DIES SUDDENLY

(Burns News.)  
 Perhaps few deaths ever occurred in Burns which brought such widespread expressions of grief as that of Oscar Swain, which took place at the residence of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. S. Swain, in this city last Saturday morning. Oscar was apparently in his usual good health on the previous Monday and went from the village of Lawen to his ranch adjoining the town. On that same day he was taken so ill that he was unable to mount his horse and leave the premises, so he took to his bed and his condition was not discovered until Wednesday, when it was found that he was suffering intensely. Word was at once conveyed by telephone to his parents here, who lost no time in reaching him and brought him home Thursday.  
 It was thought by the family and friends that his ailment was pneumonia, but the physicians quickly ascertained that he was suffering from acute Bright's disease and that his condition was practically hopeless. He died at daybreak Saturday morning.  
 Oscar Swain was highly regarded by all who knew him and his friends are legion, so his early demise is keenly mourned, and the family have universal sympathy. He was born in Dallas, Oregon, on June 6, 1882, consequently was in his 26th year. Besides his father and mother, he leaves five sisters and a brother to mourn his loss—Mrs. Julian M. Byrd, Mrs. Sam Mothershead, Clara, He'ene and Besale, and Albert Swain, all living here.
