## RAILROAD MAKES MORE THAN BEFORE PANIC

(United Press Leased Wire.) Chicago, Nov. 11.—The attention of the railroad world was called today to the statement of the earnings of the Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad during the month of September. The statement shows the largest gain in gross of any that has been made in September. While other roads showed larger profits none showed a better condition and a greater increase of business.

The roads gross earnings for September were \$6,105,873, an increase of \$572,881 over September of last year. September of last year was considered a good month. The panic had not yet set in.

Improving Hilo Harbor. (United Press Leased Wire.) Hilo, Hawaii, Nov. 11.—Work on the new breakwater in Hilo harbor which will give added protection to the ships anchored in the port and will make Hilo one of the best harbors on the Pacific ocean, is under way today. Several carloads of boulders have been put in place and 25,000 tons of rock will be brought from the Puna quarries to complete the breakwater.

## COMMITTEE TO LOOK INTO GRAFT PROSECUTION

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Nov. 11.—A committee of seven citizens appointed by Mayor E. R. Taylor, is preparing plans today for a thorough inquiry into the conduct of the "graft prosecution." The rumor that an investigation by a special committee would be proposed at the next session of the legislature caused the Citizens' League of Justice to attempt to forestall possible interference by requesting the mayor to name a committee of San Franciscans to undertake the investigation.

The men appointed by Mayor Taylor are: Dr. Henry Gibbons, dean of Cooper Medical college; Alexander Goldstein, raisin grower; the Rev. D. D. Crowley, head of the Youths' Directory; the Rev. William K. Guthrie, pastor of the first Presbyterian church; William J. French, editor of the Labor Clarion; William Denman, attorney; William Kent, capitalist.

In appointing his committee, Mayor Taylor says that so many statements of one kind and another have been made in regard to the graft prosecution, the investigation of a committee would be of benefit to the community.

The intimation that the legislators planned an investigation included the proposition to investigate the conduct of the police courts. Whether the proposal to appoint the legislative investigation committee to come from the "reformers" or the "performers" could not be ascertained.

### AFFINITIES HAVE SPATS LIKE ORDINARY COUPLES

New York, Nov. 11.—Ferdinand Pinney Earle, the artist whose claim to fame is his discovery of an "affinity" is nursing a black eye today, the result of a collision between himself and a chair in the hands of the second Mrs. Earle, according to a neighbor to whom Earle ran for protection.

The discovery that affinities can swing chairs with accuracy was made by Earle when he was quarreling with his wife, Charles Dayton, a neighbor of Earle's, who was working for the artist, heard Mrs. Earle's voice raised, then a scream, and afterward Earle came running toward him holding his head in his hands.

"My wife hit me," yelled Earle. Dayton is certain he said "wife" and not "affinity."

"What did she hit you with?" asked Dayton, who was certain some weapon had been used to inflict the injuries.

"With a chair," groaned Earle. Later Earle denied that his affinity had hit him with the furniture and called upon his wife to bear witness to their complete happiness.

"We are perfectly happy together, aren't we, dear?" he queried. "We are," was her terse response.

The casualties between Earle and his affinity are now even. Several weeks ago Earle struck and choked his soul-mate and was jailed. He pleaded guilty and paid a fine.

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SENATOR'S SECRETARY PASSED BAD CHECKS

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 11.—C. E. Young, former secretary to United States Senator John W. Daniel of Virginia, is in the city prison today, awaiting trial of numerous charges of issuing fictitious checks for small amounts. The police have also wired to San Francisco to ascertain if the man, who was formerly practicing law in Washington, D. C., and in California, is wanted in San Francisco in connection with the graft investigations.

Young was a lawyer at the national capital when Senator Daniel became attracted towards him and took him as his private secretary. Young became firmly established in Washington society but is said to have taken to drink. He then came to California where he has led a varied career.

### CLAIMS FRAUD IN SAN FRANCISCO ELECTIONS

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Nov. 11.—Judge Carroll Cook, who was defeated for re-election to the superior bench by a narrow margin of votes, is taking steps today to have a re-count made of the ballots. The judge declares that word has come to him

that many frauds were perpetrated on election day, and that a re-count will change the result and will re-seat him on the bench.

Should Cook be correct in his claim, the re-count would unseat Judge George A. Sturtevant who beat out Cook by two thousand votes. Judge Dunne, who was primarily opposed to Cook on the question of graft and anti-graft stands third in the list of the five judges elected.

Cook declares that he was not prepared to go into the expense of a re-count until persuaded to do so by the campaign committee of the Union Labor party.

### KIDNAPER PROTECTED FROM POSSE BY FRIENDS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Seattle, Nov. 11.—Another posse, with information that Leo Bezemer, who attempted to kidnap E. P. English, a wealthy logger, and hold him for ransom a few days ago, is in hiding in a log cabin, started today in search of the fugitive.

This posse is headed by Sheriff-elect C. W. Stevenson, and is making for the dense forests between Silvana and Marysville, where, it is reported, food is being brought to him by friends, who are also keeping him informed as to the movements of the posses.

Since the number of students in the University has become so large, news matter is much more abundant, and many stories are crowded out each week on account of lack of space. Thirty-five high schools have entered the League and some of them have already held their tryouts. After the tryouts have been held and debates have determined the championship team in each district, inter-district contests will be held to select the two best teams for the final debate, which takes place at the University of Oregon in May.

A new bulletin containing full information in regard to all the questions to be debated is now in the hands of the printer and will be mailed as soon as possible.
