

FAMOUS ACTRESS IS DEAD

New York, Nov. 1.—The many friends of Lydia Thompson learned today of the sudden death of the famous actress yesterday afternoon at her home in Westminister Mansions. The announcement of her demise came in a short cable message to her daughter, Zeffie Tilbury.

Lydia Thompson first came to America in 1868 and created an instant and lasting sensation. She brought with her a chorus of beautiful English girls, who with their leader became the talk of New York.

For more than twenty years the actress held away and she became best known as the greatest burlesquer of her time. Her years of work were crowned with success and she possessed a large fortune at the time of her death.

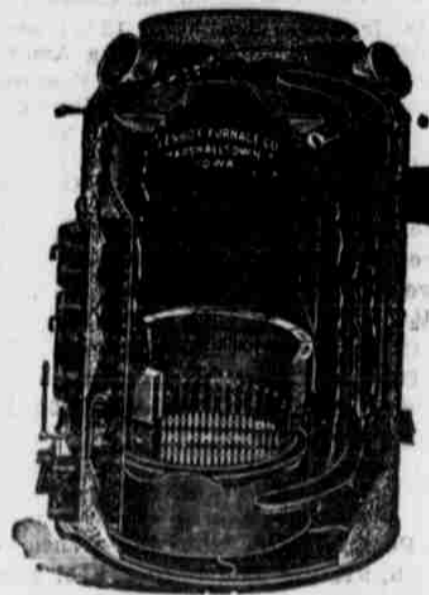
