

COURT HOUSE NEWS

Marriage licenses have been issued by County Clerk Allen to A. J. Lang, age 22, of San Francisco, and Faye Savage, age 22, of Salem; C. E. Edmondson, age 28, and Grace Holtzclaw, age 23, both of Salem.

The first suit the city has had against it for some time has been filed in the circuit court by Josie L. Slater asking the court to grant her damages done to her property through water running on it from a ditch dug by Street Commissioner J. M. Martin for street improvement purposes.

Mrs. Slater resides on Capital street and the Garden Road, and the complaint alleges that at the time the street improvement was being carried on, Street Commissioner Martin dug a ditch four feet wide adjacent to her property, and that as soon as the rains started in, the water ran down the ditch onto her land. The complaint asks damages in the sum of \$100, also that the defendant in the case be compelled to fill up the ditch. Attorney S. T. Richardson appears for the plaintiff.

GUARANTY LAW. August Hucklestein, who was the operative candidate for president-elect, standing by the issue of bank guaranty law, is quoting the following letter from President O. J. ... of the National bank of Oklahoma, in support of the measure: Enid, Okla., Nov. 10.

Dear Sir: I have your letter of Nov. 5 in regard to the Oklahoma banking law. In answer to same will say that regard Mr. Hogan's address at the Oklahoma State Bankers' Convention during our state a great injustice. National bankers of Oklahoma are not permitted, under the law, to sell themselves of the benefits and that reason they are fighting it in every possible way, and trying to discredit upon the law.

There has never been a dollar to any depositor under the Oklahoma Guaranty Law and it satisfies the depositors as well as the bankers who are operating under it. The banks in Oklahoma, since the law was passed, have made wonderful progress in increasing their business and there has not been a single Oklahoma Bank chartered in the state since the law took effect. The number of new banks started under the law are not any more than were started in Oklahoma under the old law and the idea of encouraging wild banking is absolutely absurd. We have the strictest regulations thrown upon state banks of any state in the Union and, in our opinion, here is no chance scarcely for a crooked banker of a man who has a bad reputation to even start a bank in our state. I think the law is even more strict in this respect than the National Banking Law.

As you no doubt know, we were National Bank up to August 18, at which time we surrendered our charter and took out a state charter as to avail ourselves of the Oklahoma Guaranty Law and we see no reason whatever to change our views on the steps that we took.
