SENSIBLE PUBLICITY.

A Chicago paper has the following about the good work being done by the manager of the largest electric light and power plant and street railway system in the state, or in the Pacific Northwest:

"President Josselyn of the Portland, Ore., Railway, Light and Power company, displayed good judgment in announcing that the company would spend more than \$2,000,000 on improvements and extensions, practically as soon as the plans were adopted by the board of directors. The announcement gave Mr. Josselyn the opportunity to discuss traction matter in the Portland newspapers at considerable length and to let the community understand that the company meant and wished to do well by it. Not only was the bare fact of the proposed expenditure given to the reporters, but much of the general plans were imparted, and President Josselyn took occasion to express the faith of the directors in Portland, notwithstanding the machinations of petty politicians. He also discussed traction lines and improvements in the East, and other innovations.

"Too many public service managers have been too secretive in the past about things of interest to the people, and to which general knowledge would have done no harm. President Josselyn is one of the hundreds who are breaking away from the old and mistaken policies of secrecy about matters that should be open to all."

MANY BOUGHT STOCK DURING PANIC

The most interesting result of the panic of 1907 now is shown in the reports of corporations as to the increase of the number of stockholding partners, particularly in the West and among women. Sixteen of the largest railroad and industrial corporations have reported 353,600 partners as against 255,499 before the bankers' panic began. Reports of the Hill railroads show 11,000 shareholders now as compared with 2,800 a year ago. These figures throw light upon the process of change that took place during the period when the wires from the West were burdened with small lot buying orders at bargain prices. The reports of the Steel trust and the Pennsylvania railway show that 45 per cent of the shareholder now are women, the increase being 32 per cent in the case of the Steel trust and 49 per cent in the case of the Pennsylvania, which goes to show what a real "marked down" sale will do with women. Before the panic the shareholders of the United States Steel numbered 83,000; they number over 130,000 now. The Pennsylvania has 60,000 shareholders and the Santa Fe railway has reported 25,000. This tremendous change is to be attributed largely to the West, where investments are being made in stocks and bonds much more than in former years and where the Missouri spirit of "wanting to be shown" real values has increased in a marked degree since Western speculation was checked in 1901.
