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## AYS ANTI-SALOON LEAGUE IS FAKE

(Detroit Times.)

The Anti-Saloon league is a fake. This is the summary way in which R. Mabee, who is fighting the other of that league, disposes of it. Frankly he admits that the breaking of a contract with the Anti-Saloon league office, by which he is deprived of considerable money he would have otherwise, is one reason for his animus.

Mabee is not a sanctimonious person. He says "damn" and "divy" and other things just as dreadful and approaches the subject of temperance as a problem in economics, not morals. That is because Mabee's line has been the perfecting of story systems by cutting out dates, establishing pace-makers and other devices to get the best return for money invested.

He is trying now to wipe out the Anti-Saloon league and put the temperance movement in the control of churches. He has prepared a mass of evidence to submit to the meeting of the church committees in Philadelphia next month and confidently expects to have the Anti-Saloon league reconstituted at that time. As long as the churches must be used for the work of getting prohibition, they might as well have the Anti-Saloon league. "The Anti-Saloon league is a graft. It is for the money and has sold out the temperance cause in more than one place. Furthermore, it is tied up with Standard Oil and other interests which have used its influence in electing legislators to control the votes of the legislators, to kill pipe line bills and other worthy legislation or to promote bad legislation.

The Anti-Saloon league fights the good Templars and other bodies which really want to abolish intemperance. It wants only enough prohibition to keep the saloon evil to keep contributions coming in. If we get complete prohibition, it would become of the men who make their living out of the saloon's patrons and suckers? Manufacturing and industrial

corporations can afford to pay to have the saloons wiped out. I know it because I have gotten their subscriptions on that basis. There are plenty of towns where the manufacturers would pay handsomely to get rid of the grog-shops. It means a great difference to them in the efficiency of their labor. It means a great difference to the laborer, also, as the money would go farther if the money now spent for drink were used for other things.

## GIGANTIC WORK TO BUILD CITY HALL

The old Chicago City hall is about demolished and work at once will commence on the new \$4,000,000 structure which is to be one of the largest and best equipped municipal buildings in the country. The wrecking gang will give way to the construction gang, and the passerby will cease to squint at the flying rock dust and plaster and will look on wonderingly as the great steel skeleton rears itself above the street;

11,000 tons of it, later to be clothed with 14,000 tons of granite, 33,000 tons of concrete and 6,000,000 bricks. One can imagine a train of more than 2500 cars, eighteen miles long, creeping slowly forward as the mass of steel and stone is unloaded and put in place. Two years will pass before that train is all unloaded. Close beside it and occupying the rest of the block is yet the court house, lately completed, and when the city hall is finished and the twin structures, towering 13 stories above the street, are locked together with bands of steel and concrete, there are none who doubt that they will present such an appearance and will offer such facilities for conducting the business of local government as to justify the cost—over \$8,000,000. Though a complement of the county building, the city hall will cover 1700 more square feet, will consume 1000 more tons of steel and will include 350,000 more cubic feet. The great columns of the colonnade, 9 feet in diameter and nearly 100 feet long, are the largest columns of any colonnade in the world. There will be 14 elevators, more than a mile of corridors and nearly 15 acres of floor space. This, with the county building, means the crowding of nearly 30 acres of floor space in a city block. Pneumatic tubes are to cobweb the building.

San Francisco, Nov. 20.—An advance of 90 per cent in rates on merchandise shipped between Eastern and Pacific coast points in lots of 500 pounds or more by Wells Fargo and company is announced in notices posted today in the local offices of the express company.

The announcement will bring on a fight between the express company on the one side and merchants and other shippers on the other side. Those who believe themselves injured by the advance will appear before Commissioner Franklin K. Lane of the Interstate Commerce Commission on December 5th.

The merchants announce that they desire the decision of the commission which fixed a rate last July reaffirmed. The commission withdrew its decision after a demand for a rehearing had been made. Since this action, Wells Fargo and company has presented a new rate and the merchants are preparing to prove that the action is arbitrary and that the former decision of the commission was just.
