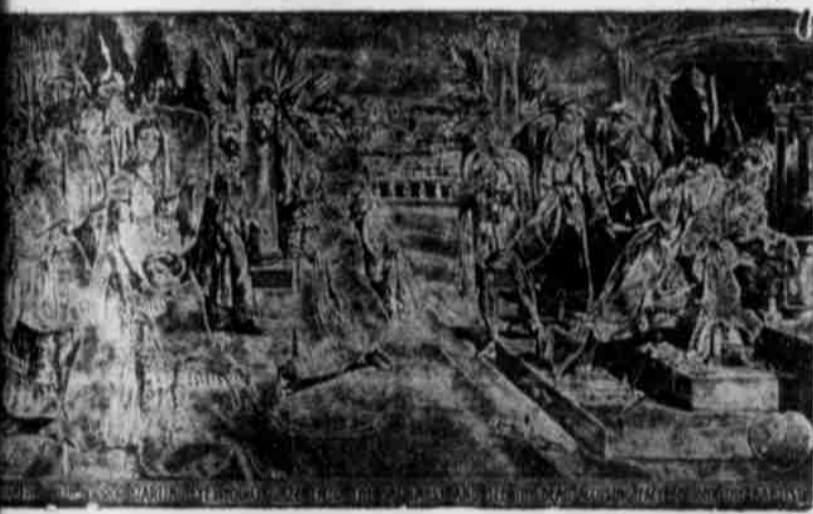

age loosened the earth from under tenements on both sides of the street until the houses tottered on the edge of the pit of fire.

Twenty-one workmen were in the sewer ditch when the explosion occurred. The hole was twenty-five feet wide and twenty-five feet deep. A considerable portion of the lower levels of the ditch had evidently been filled with gas from leaking gas main and it is thought that a spark from a workman's pipe ignited the gas. There was a flash and the foremost workmen in the ditch was blown to atoms.

The heavy planking used to bolster up the earth on the sides of the excavation caught fire immediately, the flames being fed by gas from the broken main.

Then the water main broke and the seepage carried down the sides of the excavation into the hole of fire and the entire street sides of the excavation for nearly a block sank into the hole, hurling tons of debris onto the workmen who were struggling to get out, crushing them.

Earth and solid rock slid forward from beneath the houses lining the street leaving them tottering on the edge. There was a panic in every house on the block, most of which were tenements thickly crowded with people. The police in the neighborhood hurried the tenants out and a hurry call brought more police and firemen.

Samuel Prout, while passing the block saw a woman and her child sliding into the burning abyss just after explosion and rushed forward to save their lives. He slipped and fell into the flames and was roasted to a crisp before the eyes of hundreds of persons.

Prout's was the only body recovered. The woman and her child clung to the charred end of a plank and were rescued by firemen. Prout's wife was with him at the time he gave his life trying to save the woman and child, and it was with difficulty that the police were able to restrain her from jumping into the fire after him. She is in a state of complete collapse.

Four workmen in a tiny compartment of the excavation had a miraculous escape from death. They were saved when the explosion brought timber hurling into the hole by a girder that fell crosswise just above them.

Before the fire reached them, they managed to dig into the completed sewer and waded and swam four blocks to the river where they escaped unhurt, but nearly dead from inhaling vile gases.

several hours, and that he was very bitter against England and full of the "yellow peril."

The synopsis of the interview printed here says that the Kaiser declared that England was a traitor to the white man's name, and predicted that she would ultimately lose some of her colonies through her treaty with Japan.

The invitation to the American fleet of battleships to visit New Zealand and Australia was intended to serve notice on England that those colonies were with the white men, and not with the renegade mother country. The British colonies would show by the ardor of their reception that they understood the situation.

The emperor declared that Japan is even now fomenting insurrection in India. This insurrection might break out within six months. Germany and the United States will, however, find a solution of the Eastern question.

There is a complete understanding between Emperor William and President Roosevelt on this point, the Kaiser said. They intend to divide the East against itself by becoming

the recognized friend of China. Negotiations have been progressing favorably for months. A very high Chinese official, the emperor said, would soon visit Germany and America. Terms will then be made known guaranteeing the protection and integrity of China and the open door.

Every statesman now realizes, the emperor declared, that Russia in her great struggle with Japan was really fighting the white man's cause—fighting it miserably. The emperor expressed sympathy with Russia, remarking how different the result would have been if the burden of carrying the white man's standard had been placed by Providence upon his invincible battalions. If Japan were suffered now to get control of China, Europe would suffer an attack. The emperor is keeping friends with the Mohammedan world. He is even supplying them with rifles, because they are devils in a fight and stand there between the East and the West, where they can break the first force of attack.

Emperor William said he believed that America would be forced to fight Japan within ten years. He seemed surprised to find that the stream of criticism upon England for two hours.
