WHO IS MR. E. LORKEN OF SALEM

Sheriff Fenton has in his possession a mysterious suit case, which from all appearances has seen better days, says the Roseburg Review. The case was originally billed from Myrtle Point to this city, coming by stage. Upon its arrival here orders were received to ship it to Salem, and this was done on March 12, 1908. A few days ago the sheriff received a letter from the Southern Pacific officials at the capital city to the effect that the case was still at the depot unclaimed. Wishing to locate the owner Mr. Fenton immediately wired to have it sent this city and in accordance with his command it arrived last Friday afternoon. From all appearances the case is the property of a timber buyer, containing numerous geological maps as well as a number of instruments used by cruisers in estimating timber. A tag attached bears the name of Mr. E. Torpen, together with the address of Salem, Oregon. Mr. Fenton will hold the case for a couple of weeks at which time he will dispose of it to the junk dealer should the owner fail to call and prove his property.

RAISING \$50,000 FOR ALBANY COLLEGE

Albany college has launched a campaign for a \$50,000 endowment. Friday, November 20, will be "College Day" in Albany and on that date an effort will be made to raise \$10,000 in that city as a nucleus for the fund. An endowment now seems assured for Albany college by the action of the college board of the Presbyterian church of the United States. The president of this board has promised to give one dollar for an endowment for Albany college for every dollar raised in Oregon up to \$25,000 thus providing for a \$50,000 endowment. With this encouragement, President Crooks and the board of trustees of the college have inaugurated a movement to raise \$25,000 in this state. Albany college has been doing better work this year than ever along all lines of collegiate effort. It has a larger faculty, better equipment, an improved library, the biggest conservatory of music it has ever had, better opportunities in oratory and debating, while in its athletic department the football team has won the championship of the non-conference colleges of Oregon. With the first big offer of help from the National college board of the Presbyterian church and the prospects of the realization of its first endowment, the college faces the brightest period of its history.

CHICAGO SALOONS BRING IN \$7,000,000

Over \$7,000,000 of Chicago income this year will come from saloons, which makes the item of dog tax look sick—only \$128,000. The increased cost of licenses from \$500 a year to \$1000 did drive about 1000 thirst emporiums out of business, but made an enormous increase in the city's revenues. The taxes on the two billions of assessable property brought in a revenue of only \$4,561,453 last year, so the saloon business looms up as the city's biggest producer with revenues from the traction business, under Chicago's prize solution of municipal control of public utilities coming next, at over \$1,000,000 a year. The city had 8097 saloons in 1905, and the revenues therefrom were only \$4,000,000, so the decrease of 1000 in the numbers of licenses as result of higher cost was much more than offset. It is said that the number of women running saloons has not been affected by the price set on their licenses. The process of elimination has been gradual—the numbers being reduced from 8097 saloons to 7353 at the outset, to 7237 after they had six months more of the license increase, to still fewer each six months since then. The police department costs the city \$5,610,845, the house of correction \$275,252, and the municipal courts \$807,687 a year. With these figures friends and foes of prohibition can both prove their contentions.
