MURDERER ESCAPES FROM JAIL

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Francisco, Nov. 23.—Fourteen armed guards are watching every avenue of escape from the Sutro forest today, expecting to capture Samuel H. Taylor, the convicted murderer who escaped from the county jail last Saturday night and has been at large ever since. The fugitive is known to be desperate and orders have been issued to shoot him down without mercy as soon as he is discovered. Taylor made his escape shortly after 6 o'clock Saturday night, when the prison cooks, of which he was one, had ended their work. No one saw him leave the jail, and as it is evident that he scaled the prison wall, the presumption is that he was aided by confederates outside of the grounds. Three minutes after he escaped, his absence was noted and the search for him was commenced. The hunt continued all day Sunday and is being vigorously pressed today.

Nov. 23.—Acting under orders from Washington, Rear Admiral Sperry today sent a board of surgeons ashore to investigate the cholera condition and it is ardently hoped by the people of Manila that he will change his attitude and allow the men of the fleet shore leave. Much bitterness is felt toward Sperry throughout the city and other eastern ports are taking advantage of his ruling to injure Manila as a commercial center. Tourists are being kept away and the merchants say the injury will be felt for a long time. "The worst of it is the battleships should not be a medium of advertising Manila as a place where a sailor cannot set foot for fear he will die of disease," is the assertion heard on all sides. The appointment of the board of surgeons was the result of a complaint made to Washington.

WOULD SPEND LARGE SUM ON BREMERTON

Washington, D. C., Nov. 23.—Navy officers today are making unofficial favorable comments on the recommendation of Admiral R. C. Holly Day, chief of the bureau of yards and docks, for large appropriations for insular stations and for a higher standard in the equipment and maintenance of home navy yards. Among the recommendations is the request for an appropriation of \$1,391,000 is asked for purposes of improving the Bremerton yard on Puget Sound. The need of additional dry docks at all the yards is also urged. The estimates submitted on the Puget Sound yard are as follows: Public works, including repairs and preservations, \$811,730; maintenance, yards and docks, \$1,500,000; contingent, yards and docks \$30,000.

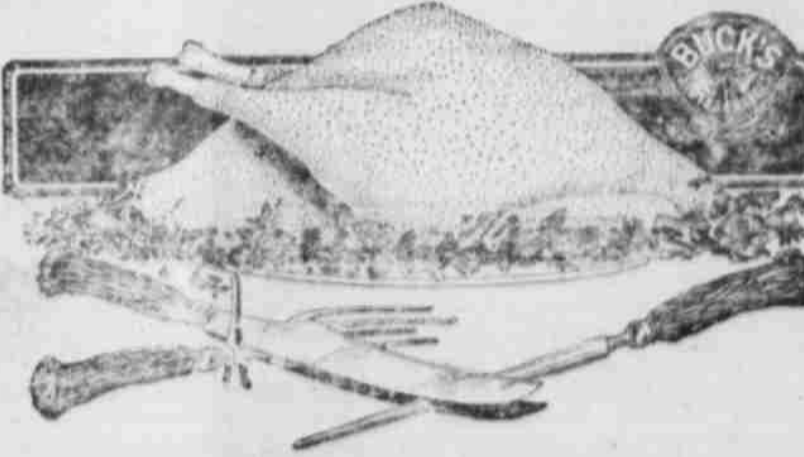
