HOLD WATER COMPANY LIABLE FOR \$42,000,000 LOSS IN QUAKE FIRE

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Francisco, Nov. 25.—It was announced today that steps are being taken by a number of fire insurance companies to petition the United States circuit court to appoint a receiver for the Spring Valley Water company, it being alleged that, with \$17,000,000 worth of claims already filed against the corporation and an additional \$25,000,000 coming from life insurance companies in the East, the water company's \$25,000,000 of capital stock will be in no way equal to meet obligations.

The need of a receiver for the corporation, say the insurance officials who are working up the sensational case, is imperative, as the protection of the court is all that will prevent the alienation of any Spring Valley property which might become available to meet those claims which might later receive favorable consideration.

The suits against the Spring Valley are being strengthened by refer-

ence to the recent decision of Judge Farrington who held the corporation partially culpable for the heavy losses in the great fire because it had, contrary to advice of experts, laid its pipe line over marshy land.

USED PULLMANS TO SMUGGLE CHINESE

Chicago, Nov. 25.—The police are holding J. F. Yanner, a Pullman car cook today at the request of secret service agents, on a charge of smuggling Chinese into the United States at El Paso, Texas, from Mexico. Government officials declare that Pullman cars are being used by employees of the car company to smuggle the Orientals past the immigration officers.

The arrest is the first step in an active campaign made by Commissioner General of Immigration F. H. Larned. The department has been working on the cases for some time and Yanner was arrested before he released at the instance of the government.

Yanner is being held in \$3000 bonds.

"SAILOR" BURKE WINS FROM JOE THOMAS

Boston, Mass., Nov. 25.—Sailor Burke was awarded the decision over Joe Thomas in a 12-round contest here last night. The fans are saying today that the merits of the struggle would have been better expressed in a draw, as Thomas repeatedly had his opponent at a disadvantage and might have won had he shown the aggressiveness which he displayed in his previous bouts. Burke turned the tables on his opponent in the 11th round and would have won had not the gong saved Thomas.

PEERED IN WINDOWS IN SOUTH SALEM

The night police were notified by evening by some South Commercial street residents that a suspicious-looking character was in their vicinity, and was making himself notorious by peering into people's windows, and then going away before he could be accosted. The police made a visit to the complaining district, and succeeded in finding the "mysterious" character, who gave his name as the police officer as Adam Banberger, a total stranger in the city.
