One-Way Vehicle Traffic. New York, like New York, has its own congestion problem. Its new street commission is forming traffic rules on which it is the advice of master teaming men, property owners, automobilists, and tries to reconcile their divergent opinions. One aim is to decrease the congestion of the shopping district by limiting the delivery of freight and express matter to certain streets and another would confine traffic between the railroad stations to routes, and yet another would allow moving vehicles near the curbstone, prohibit them from the up to the sidewalk instead of bleeding from the side, forbid the use of street car tracks, interpose large stones to make wheels turn square corners.

These proposals numerous objections have been urged at the Board of Public Safety hearings. Doubtless, if they, when modified, will be found feasible. But upon one plan there is substantial unanimity—the plan of one-way vehicle traffic in the most crowded streets.

A tentative rule was framed in West and Bromfield streets. Traffic shall move from east to west in winter and school streets west to east, and in Temple both ways, there was little objection.

New York one-way traffic had beginnings in the blocks about 100 squares, but the devoting of longer or considerable lengths of street to vehicles all running in one direction has not been tried.

Below Forty-second street Battery is choked during business hours with a conflicting traffic of street car, motorcar, truck and taxicab. The progress of traffic would be at once facilitated by giving half the street, extending from the street cars, either to the north or to the south of adjacent streets. We shall be forced to this plan, even now it is urgently necessary.—New York Times.

Alcohol in Germany. In Germany alcohol is produced from almost all materials containing carbohydrates, such as potatoes, fruits, including cherries, plums, and other stone fruits, berries, grapes, currants, raisins, wine, wine lees, fruit and wine cake, rye, barley, wheat, corn, dahl or sorghum, etc. But the greater portion is manufactured from potatoes.

During the campaign year just passed the quantities of the principal materials used in the production of spirits were, in metric tons of 2,204.6 pounds, as follows: Potatoes, 9,727,493; barley, 172,201; rye, 109,252; corn and dahl, 104,347; other grain, 26,772. Gallons: Cherries, 12,284; plums, 64,368; other stone and berry fruits, 43,113; cherries, 292; wine lees, 949,142; wine and fruit cake, 272,207; grape skins, 6,757,190.

As there were 9,727,493 tons of potatoes (160,218,204 bushels) in the various distilleries from which 78,445,815 gallons of alcohol were produced, or 77.3 per cent of the total output—101,473,345 gallons—the following figures concerning the production of potatoes in Germany are interesting.

The potato in Germany has been brought to a high state of perfection by an elaborate scheme of scientific fertilizing and cultivation, organized by the Bureau of Agriculture, and by continued experiments from year to year, until the whole system of planting, cultivating and harvesting has been reduced to exact practical methods.—Consular Report.

# SPAULDING (Continued from page 1)

Spaulding Logging Company, and after the first good rise of water, eight or ten million feet more will be on hand for delivery. These lots are just a small portion of the many million feet which come to this city and are converted into lumber by the Salem mill.

The foreign, or out of town trade, in the lumber business, has not become fairly started as yet, but the regular demand is predicted by the lumber men, and possibly a greater demand will be made than last year, in which case, the big saws will be pushed to their capacity night and day. The local lumber output this season for the past few months, has been enormous, due to the many, dwelling and other establishments being erected. The Spaulding Logging company also have an enormous railroad trade. Every winter carries car of bridge lumber, ties and other classes of lumber for repair and rebuilding purposes is delivered along the Southern Pacific line by the Spaulding company.

It has been generally rumored about the city that the Spaulding people were planning to move their offices on the west side of Front street across to the corner of Ferry and Front, and on the ground where the office now stands, erect a shingle mill. When approached in regard to this move, the Spaulding company signified no intention of constructing a shingle mill, and were surprised to learn that a mill was projected. In the second place, the company states that to build a shingle mill of any serviceable size, would occupy twice as much space as that on which the office now stands.

Cement Plant Abandoned. Had not the city council extended the fire limit in such a manner as to take in the vacated lot which the Spaulding company owns at the corner of Ferry and Front streets, a first-class cement block machine was to have been installed on that property for making cement blocks for sale. The proposed cement block plant was to have been erected on this property, and a covering in shed form built over it for the sole protection from the wet but, owing to the ordinance covering the fire limit prohibiting even a temporary shed or building of any kind to be constructed in the designated limits, Mr. Spaulding did not think it advisable to proceed with the plant. Had the plant been installed at this corner, a fine large cement block building would have been forthcoming within a few months, but as it is, the property will probably lie vacant for an indefinite space of time.
