TRIBUTE TO CATHERINE TINGLEY FROM CUBA

International Headquarters Universal Brotherhood and Theosophical Society, Point Loma, Cal.)

Information received today by the people of Santiago de Cuba, states the dedication and unveiling of the Memorial Archway and the laying of the corner-stone of the Cuban quarter of the Universal Brotherhood and Theosophical Society, at the Raja Yoga schools, took place on San Juan Hill, Nov. 22nd.

The parade consisted of three companies of Rural guards and a company of Cuban artillery, companies of American soldiers, and 60 men on horseback, carrying a flag representing one of the nations of the world, 50 containing the invited guests, carriage being adorned with flowers and flags. The governor of the province of Santiago de Cuba, the provincial council, mayor city council, American and army officers, foreign consuls, etc., attended the ceremonies. The whole city turned out to see the parade and an enormous crowd attended the ceremonies. The parade moved the principal streets of the city and continued on to San Juan Hill, which is just outside the city.

The historic site of the famous battle of San Juan Hill where General Shafter and General Liwa were defeated, and the famous charge, and including the Hill, was purchased by Katherine Tingley two years ago, after the purchase from both the Spanish and American governments had been refused. There the beautiful Memorial Archway of Egyptian style of architecture was unveiled. It is situated directly in front of the famous "Surrender Tree," where the articles of the surrender of the city were signed by General Shafter and General Liwa. The archway bears three large bronze plates, one of which dedicates it as a "Tribute to Katherine Tingley, on behalf of the Universal Brotherhood and Theosophical Society to the memory of the Cuban and American heroes of the war of 1898." This is surmounted by a laurel wreath artistically wrought in bronze. The two side plates bear quotations from the writings of Madame Blavatsky and William Q. Judge, the predecessors of Mrs. Tingley as head of the organization. Afterwards a granite shaft that Mrs. Tingley had erected on the line of trenches assailed by the American troops was unveiled. It bears an appropriate inscription.

The corner-stone was then laid by Katherine Tingley with most impressive ceremonies. In a large cavity in the corner-stone were placed many objects of future historical interest. Notwithstanding the intensity of the political crisis in Cuba, the people of Santiago showed the greatest interest in the celebration and the future work of Mrs. Tingley in the island. The latter has determined to establish her school in Havana and Santa Clara. They are already firmly established in Santiago de Cuba and Pinar del Rio.

MRS. BILLIK DIES OF BROKEN HEART

Manila, O., Nov. 27.—Mrs. Sara Billik, mother of Hermann Billik, who is condemned to hang in the electric chair, died of a broken heart this morning.

The aged woman broke down physically when her son was convicted of poisoning the Vrazak family through the long unsuccessful struggle for his life she followed.

When the final ruling of the court was announced and Governor Gooding signed his firm determination not to interfere with the decision, Mrs. Billik began to have severe pains in her heart.

The culmination came Wednesday when she received a pathetic letter from her son, protesting his innocence and at the same time begging his loss of hope.

When she read the words, written in a last message to her before she was to be executed, she fell on the floor, her frail old body collapsed. Her feeble heart gave way. Physicians were summoned hurriedly and succeeded in keeping her alive until today, but she had striven to the fight mentally apparently had no desire to recover.

The friends of the woman, who had seen her fade away and die, were burdened with grief, almost to the point that she did not live to see the execution.
