### REDUCE WORKING FORCE ON CANAL

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
Ancon, Canal Zone, Nov. 28.—“No help wanted,” is the sign hung out over the Panama Canal zone today. The reason for this, as explained by the government authorities, is that the work on the “big ditch” has passed its highest point, so far as the employment of men is concerned. The present tendency is not to employ more men but to reduce the force, and this applies alike to clerical, artisan and labor classes. From this forward, the work in the canal zone will be confined largely to actual canal building, including excavating and dam and lock construction. Building and municipal work, erecting houses, installing water and sewer systems and road making have reached the stage where most of the expenditure from this time forth will be for maintenance.

On this account, the forces formerly engaged in municipal engineering and building have been reduced, and in consequence, the services of a painters, plumbers and other artisans have been dispensed with. Wherever possible the men whose services are not needed in one division of the work are employed on another and this system of transferring members of the present force also reduces the number of positions open to new men.

### LOOKING OUT FOR PACIFIC SHIPBUILDERS

Washington, D. C., Nov. 28.—The construction of six torpedo boats by Pacific coast builders has been suggested to the President by Victor H. Metcalf, former secretary of the navy who is preparing today to leave Washington.

Metcalf suggests six of the eight mosquito craft should be built on Pacific coast. Delivery on the Pacific coast would handicap eastern builders so much that they would be compelled to relinquish the contract.

He also told the President that he believed it would be good policy for him to allow Truman H. Newberry, acting secretary of the navy, to permit the happenings at the Newport conference to be published.

### COPPER MINES WILL EMPLOY THOUSANDS

Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 28.—There is much rejoicing today in the copper regions as far north from here as White Horse over the news that the advance in the price of copper has made it possible for the operators to throw open their mines, many of which have been idle for a year. Within the next few weeks it is expected that employment will be given to 1000 men alone in the Britannia mine on Howe Sound, twenty miles north of Vancouver.

## PRISON CONDITIONS WILL CAUSE GLASH BETWEEN TWO STATES

Woman Commissioner, Who Will Expose Atrocious Conditions of Kansas Penitentiary to Oklahoma Legislature Missing—Haskell and Hoch at Outs.

Fort Worth, Tex., Nov. 28.—Fearing an investigation, the outcome of which may cause an open rupture between the state of Oklahoma and Kansas, Governor Haskell is today trying to find Miss Kate Barnard, commissioner of charities and corrections in Oklahoma. Miss Barnard has vanished and her friends here say that she will not be heard from until after December 5, when she will make a report to the Oklahoma legislature regarding alleged terrible conditions in the Kansas penitentiary at Lansing, where Oklahoma convicts are incarcerated.

Startling charges of cruelty are said to be made against the Lansing prison officials in Miss Barnard's report. Haskell and Governor Hoch of Kansas were reported to have clashed on this subject and the former now fears a crisis will be precipitated if Miss Barnard's charges are allowed to go to the legislature without first being subjected to examination.

To avoid trouble Miss Barnard has dropped from sight, reportedly to have seen Miss Barnard's report she accuses officials of the prison with brutality toward the convicts in their custody, and second, with neglecting her when she went to investigate the conditions. Among the brutalities which the prisoners are alleged to be subjected to are racks, sprockets by which they are swung by the wrists for hours in coffins in which offenders are packed and then have water poured over them, and various other devices similar to those employed in the middle ages.
