WHY NOT BUILD EVERYTHING OF WOOD.

So-called conservative businessmen in the city council oppose a concrete and steel bridge on South Commercial street because they say **THE INTEREST ON SUCH A STRUCTURE WOULD MAINTAIN A WOODEN BRIDGE.**

Suppose that is true? Is it a good business argument? Let us examine into it.

The big steel bridge cost \$75,000. At 5 per cent the annual interest would be \$3750 a year.

That would maintain a wooden bridge or build one every ten years. **WHY NOT HAVE A WOODEN ONE?**

The court house cost \$100,000. The interest on that would build a wooden one every ten years. **WHY NOT BUILD A WOODEN COURT HOUSE?**

The city hall cost \$60,000. At 5 per cent you could build a new wooden city hall every ten years. Why not build a wooden city hall?

The high school cost \$70,000. At 5 per cent you could build a new one every ten years on the interest. **WHY NOT BUILD A WOODEN HIGH SCHOOL?**

The State house cost half a million. At 5 per cent you could build a wooden one every ten years. **WHY NOT A WOODEN STATE HOUSE?**

The interest on cement sidewalks would build wooden ones every five years, yet the **CONCRETE SIDEWALKS TAKE THE PLACE OF WOODEN WALKS.**

If the concrete and steel bridge on South Commercial street cost \$32,000, at 5 per cent interest, or \$1600 a year, **WOULD THAT MAINTAIN A WOODEN BRIDGE?**

Even if it would, it is not a good argument. Smaller cities than Salem in Idaho and Eastern Oregon are building bridges of steel and concrete and the rich metropolises of the Willamette **DO NOT TO CONSIDER SUCH A THING.**

When the people fully realize that **PERMANENT CONCRETE AND STEEL BRIDGES ARE JUST AS ECONOMICAL AS CONCRETE SIDEWALKS AND PERMANENT BUILDINGS,** they will sweep away a city council that seeks to impose wooden bridges upon them.

If the people are given a chance they will express themselves in no uncertain manner in favor of a permanent bridge at South Commercial street.

THE MURDER OF ATTORNEY FISHER.

The shooting of Prosecutor Fisher by J. A. Finch was a triple misfortune.

It is a terrible blow to his family, who are **ENTITLED TO THE DEEPEST SYMPATHY.**

FAMOUS VIOLINIST TO PLAY AT THE THEATER TONIGHT

Maud Powell, violinist, was born in Peru, Ill. Her father was of English-Welsh extraction, and her mother was of German-Hungarian stock. At the age of 9, Mme. Powell was playing the piano and violin in public. Her earliest lessons were from William Fichensher and his daughter in Aurora. For four years she studied the violin with William Lewis, in Chicago, and the piano with Miss Agnes Ingersoll. Went to Europe for further study at the age of 13.

She spent a year with Schradieck in Leipzig, at the end (1881) was awarded a diploma at the examination held in the Gewandhaus; a year at the Paris conservatory with Danciel; then at the advice of Leonard, went to England in 1883. She played in London and the English provinces. In London she met Joachim, who became so interested in her he put her at once into his class in the Royal Academic High School of Music. She made her debut in Germany at the Philharmonic concert in Berlin in 1885.

At the end of a year she returned to the United States, and made her first appearance at a concert of the Philharmonic Society of New York. Theodore Thomas, conductor, November 14, 1885, when she played Bruch's First Concerto. Since that time she has lived the life of a virtuoso. She has played in the chief cities of the world, with orchestras and in recital. She has toured in Germany, France, Denmark, Austria, Holland, Poland, Russia, Belgium and South Africa.

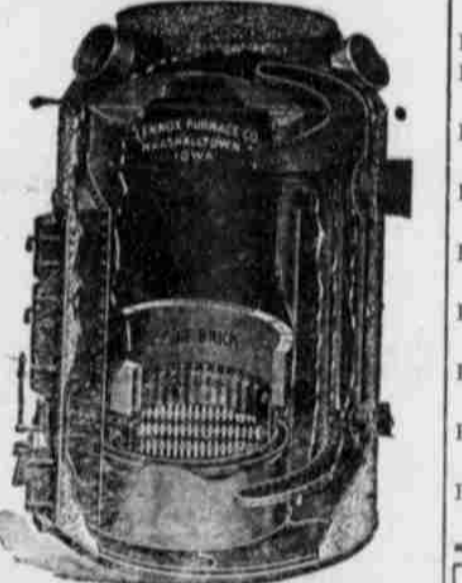
