Here the two men clinched, and, in the struggle, both received dangerous wounds The noise of the fight attracted the pt tention of a policeman, who placed both combatants under arrest.

GOVERNMENT DOES

NOT OBEY ITS LAW

Tacoma, Wash., Dec. 1.—State Railroad Inspector Perley announc d today that, as a result of his investigation into conditions at the Puget Sound navy yard, he was satisfied that the United States government was violating in a flagrant manner the safety appliance laws, under which it has in the last few years collected thousands of dollars in fines from the railroads. Perley says that he cannot interfere because the alleged defective cars are being operated on government property.
