MACHINE'S PLAN TO RULE OR RUIN.

MEET A WEAK DEFENCE AGAINST SUCH AN AGGREGATION

The people of Oregon will win, but it may be at the expense and ruin of the Republican party.

A STATE MEAT INSPECTION LAW NEEDED.

The United States law requires very rigid inspection of swine, cattle and sheep sold to packing houses.

It also requires rigid inspection of the meats after they are dressed and READY TO BE SENT OUT INTO THE RETAIL MARKETS.

It is an actual fact that from one to three per cent of the livestock sent to large packing houses IS CONDEMNED AND REJECTED.

We need not inquire what per cent of livestock goes to uninspected slaughter houses. But the point we wish to raise is that we should have state inspection, as well as federal.

This state has a state food dairy commissioner, who could properly pay some attention TO PRINCIPAL ARTICLES OF FOOD PRODUCT LIKE MEAT.

While no doubt many of the leading butchers of the state never slaughter any but sound animals, there are others not so scrupulous.

There can be no valid objection to proper state inspection of meats, BEFORE AND AFTER KILLING.

There is no way to protect the consumer, but to supplement federal inspection with state inspection.

The abattoirs not under federal inspection now WILL BE BENEFITED BY STATE INSPECTION. There is at present constant effort to discriminate against meats that have no certificate of government inspection.

And there is some ground for the prejudice. It is a matter that should not be discussed in a sensational manner, BUT OUT OF JUSTICE TO THE CONSUMER.

The time is coming when the public will demand scientific inspection of all meats, and meat products.

A state law requiring inspection of live stock and of slaughtered meats would be beneficial to the producer, the butcher and packer, and the general public.

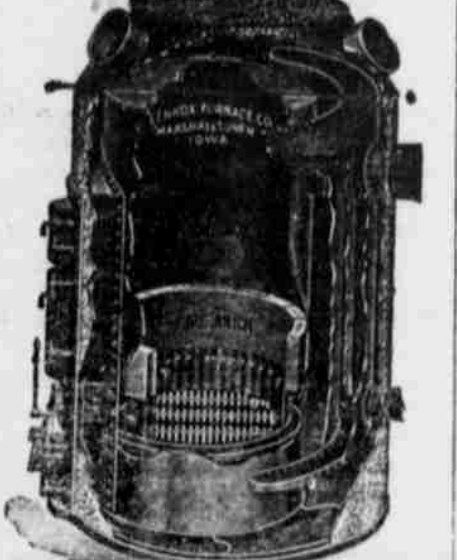
