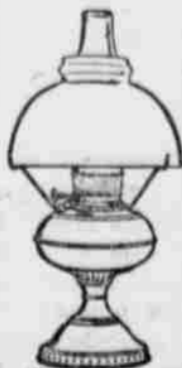

New York, Dec. 2.—Clarence D. Van Duzer, former congressman from Nevada, is at liberty today under the guarantee of his attorneys for his appearance in court, pending the settlement of a \$500 claim asked by a judgment creditor. Van Duzer was taken into custody

The judgment was for a printing bill of \$500 against the Van Duzer Mining and Development Company, a concern Van Duzer operated while he was a member of congress. Van Duzer's attorneys, Delmas, Thowne and Spellman, guaranteed Van Duzer's appearance when wanted and he was released. It is said that Van Duzer is fully able to meet the bill.

## TUNNEL THROUGH THE SIERRAS

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
San Francisco, Dec. 2.—The great Spring Garden tunnel, the longest and largest in California, and the biggest bore on the line of the Western Pacific railroad, will be punched through next Friday, according to the announcement of officials of the road today.

The tunnel was started a year ago, and after the top bore is finished on Friday, there will still remain five months' work getting the tunnel down to floor level.

The engineering difficulties encountered have made the work one of the greatest engineering feats in tunnel-boring in the United States. The length of the tunnel, its grade and the fact that a spring was encountered in the center of it gave the engineers a year of trouble.

Contrary to expectation, no precious minerals were found, although the bore bisected the mineral range in the Sierras near the Feather river.

## WHEELER MAY GET IN CABINET

Washington, D. C., Dec. 2.—William R. Wheeler, assistant secretary of commerce and labor, is suggested today by the politicians for a place in the cabinet of President-elect Taft. A cabinet position is being conceded to the Pacific coast, and since the name of George A. Knight aroused discussion and opposition, the chances of Wheeler have been discussed.

Wheeler, as assistant secretary, has had the requisite experience, and has shown himself capable of succeeding Secretary Strauss. If the latter should lay down the portfolio, Wheeler, however, has shown adaptability, and another post in the cabinet may be his.

## MACHINE GOVERNOR HINDERS INQUIRY

(United Press Leased Wire.)  
Sacramento, Cal., Dec. 2.—Although the investigation of the affairs of the office of State Printer W. W. Shannon is formally ended today by the committee of assemblymen appointed for the purpose of investigating the charges of Assemblyman Richard Jury, of San Mateo, that the committee was hindered in its investigations by Governor James N. Gillett, are still causing discussion here.

Jury declared at the last meeting of the committee yesterday afternoon that not only Governor Gillett but other members of the administration hampered the inquiry. He said that Secretary of State Charles Curry and local printers, who were called as witnesses, gave testimony favorable to Shannon, without regard to their knowledge of the fact.

The other members of the committee dissented from the statement of Jury, and supported the governor. It was finally decided by them to close the inquiry, and a report will be prepared and submitted to the governor at the next session of the legislature.

Because the contemplated advance by the steamship company will correspond with the threatened increase of rail rates, many of the business men of San Francisco insist that, despite denials from railroad and steamer agents, some understanding has been reached between the two companies. The most significant feature of the new rates is that only California and California products are affected by the schedules. Dried fruit, canned fruit, canned salmon and leather are some of the principal commodities which will have to pay a heavier tariff than formerly, and the shippers are up in arms over the prospect.
