

MARRIED TITLE OF EUROPE

Princess De Broglie, American Heiress, Now Sings in Cafes to Support Herself and Her Child.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Paris, Dec. 3.—The Princess De Broglie, formerly Mrs. S. B. Veit, of Chicago, and before that, the beautiful and talented Estelle Alexander, of San Francisco, who is suing Prince Rupert De Broglie for divorce on the ground of desertion, now is supporting herself and children by singing in the leading cafes.

The predicament of the fiancée points a fresh moral to the long and picturesque history of international marriages between titled Europeans and American heiresses. Mrs. Veit was a beauty, to whom society on both sides of the water paid homage, but she went her way indifferently and yielded only to the fervent courting of the young prince, when only 21 years of age, and still a student at the naval academy. The family objected, and, finally, the pair eloped and were married at Milan. The prince's father was obdurate, his allowance was cut off, and for a long while he and his wife endured hardships and dire poverty, the prince being unable to find employment of any kind for his royal hands. At last, the strain proved too much, and wife and husband separated.

SILVER MINES TO SHUT DOWN

(United Press Leased Wire.) Tonopah, Nev., Dec. 3.—The owners of the large silver mines of Tonopah and the camps near here are discussing today the question of closing their workings until the price of silver rises. The continual depression of the silver market will probably force the mines to close according to the operators, unless the tendency of the white metal to hover about 45 cents is dissipated.

It is rumored that the Philadelphia capitalists who control the Tonopah mining corporation have already wired their manager to stop operations. Ore that has been taken out of the shaft will be kept in the dumps and the shipping of bullion will cease temporarily.

Three thousand men will be thrown out during the holidays if the mines close before Christmas.
