# LITIGATION OVER RAISING A BUILDING

The case of Max Buren and C. S. Hamilton against the city of Salem is being heard today before Circuit Judge Galloway, and the fire limit ordinance formerly adopted by the city council is the principal cause of the suit.

Buren & Hamilton instigated the suit against the city who forbade them the privilege of making a reconstruction of a small building belonging to them on Liberty street, between Court and State, on the grounds that it was a wooden structure, and not in compliance with the ordinance covering such establishments through their agents, Recorder Moores and Chief of Police Gibson, put a stop to the raising of the building in question, at the time a new grade was established on Liberty street, and a cement sidewalk constructed, thus rendering the structure practically useless, owing to the new street improvements being a foot higher than formerly, and setting the building down below the sidewalk. The fire ordinance at that time prevented all action taken by Buren & Hamilton to remedy the condition of the building, which was in such a situation that tenants would not notice it.

The plaintiffs asks the court to give a decree preventing further molestation and interference in the work of raising the structure level with the sidewalk, and that the defendants be required to pay all costs and disbursements of the suit.

Attorneys C. L. McNary and John McNary are appearing for Buren & Hamilton and G. G. Bingham and Walter Keyes for the defendants.
