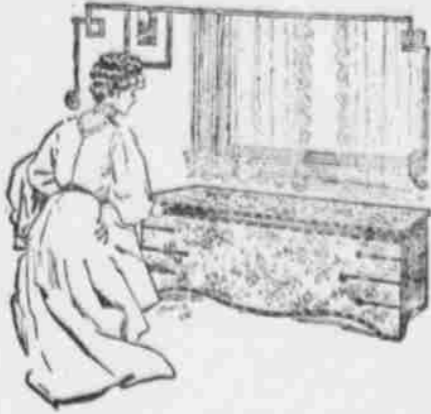

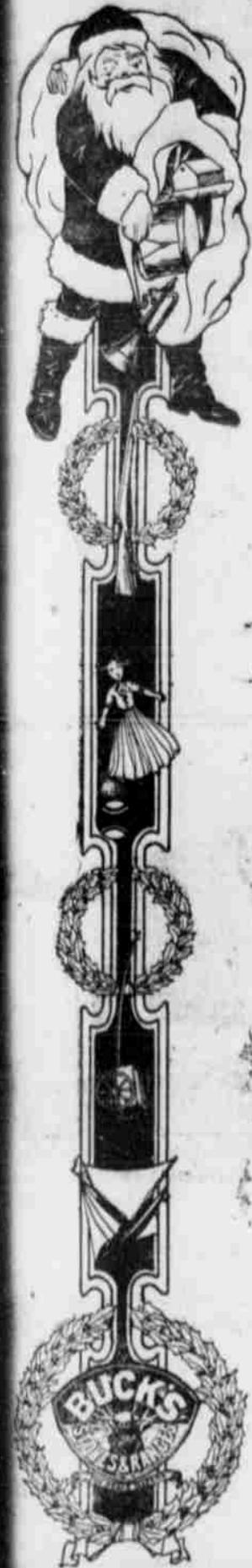


TABOURETTES.

DIED IN THE NAVY 44 YEARS

New York, Dec. 5.—Rear-Admiral Joseph B. Coghlan, retired, died suddenly of heart disease at his home in Rochelle, N. Y., today.
Admiral Coghlan was born in Lakford, Ky., December 9, 1844, nearly 64 years old when he died.
He was graduated from the United States naval academy in 1863 and served in the Civil war as an ensign.
In 1868 he received his promotion to lieutenant commander and was assigned to the training ship Portsmouth. From 1871 to 1873 he was in the Hydrographic office at Washington, D. C., and, after a year's leave, was placed in command of the USS Saugus for a year. He next served in succession on the Colorado,

Monongahela and the training ship Independence.
In 1882 he was made commander and, after a year on the Adams, was assigned to the Mare Island navy yard, where he remained from 1896 to 1898. After commanding the Monongahela for two years, he was made inspector of ordinance at the League Island navy yard in the eighth district. With the rank of Captain, he commanded the Richmond in 1887 and then was transferred to the Raleigh.
He was with the Asiatic fleet during the Spanish war and participated in the battle of Manila bay on May 1, 1898. For conspicuous conduct in that engagement, he was made commandant of the Puget Sound navy yard, and later, was made captain of the New York navy yard.
In 1892 he was elevated to the rank of rear admiral and made second

in command of the north Atlantic fleet for two years. From 1904 to 1907 he was commandant of the New York navy yard.
Coghlan earned more than national fame when he composed and recited at a banquet the daring ballad, the title of which was: "Hoch Der Kaiser," and the refrain of which ran: "Me und Gott."
His last important public appearance was when he served as grand marshal of the great Taft parade in New York just before the last election.
Paul Thompson and brother, Frank have returned to their homes in Baker City, Oregon, after several days' business visit in this city and Dallas.

J. M. Morlock Dead—
J. M. Morlock, an old resident of South Salem, and about 75 years of age, died in San Francisco yesterday, December 4. W. J. Elyton received a dispatch saying that the body would be shipped from San Francisco December 5 at 4 o'clock, which will bring it to this city about Monday, on which date the funeral will be held. One of Mr. Morlock's daughters will accompany the body, which will be interred by the side of his wife. Mr. Morlock left the Capital City three or four years ago. While here he had many friends, who will regret to learn of his death.

Jeffries et ux to prevent claims alleged by the defendants on a tract of land in section 8, township 8 south, range 3 west in Marion county, containing 315.72 acres of land which the complaint alleges belongs to L. H. Henning and wife solely.
