BRITISH PROTECTED AMERICAN RESIDENTS

(United Press Leased Wire.) Peking, Dec. 7.—News reached the foreign office in this city today that the Americans in the Yangtze Kiang territory through William Martin, the American consul general at Hankow, have been compelled to ask the British representatives to look after American interests at Nanking, where insurrections have been in progress. This extraordinary conditions of affairs has been brought about through the withdrawal of the American gunboats to Manila to join the Pacific fleet for target practice.

The American residents at Nanking are indignant at the removal of the war vessels at a time when their property and even their lives were in danger. They say that, if the revolutionists had taken Nanking in their last outbreak, an insurrection would have broken out in three or four other places.

TO AVOID CONTEST RELINQUISH \$25,000

San Francisco, Dec. 7.—Through a compromise effected today by the attorneys of the interested parties, Mrs. Gladys Richardson, widow of Erskine Richardson, the wealthy manufacturer who committed suicide in the St. Avery apartments on September 12 last, will get probably \$45,000 instead of \$20,000 of her late husband's \$100,000 estate. In the will, which Richardson signed 11 days before he ended his life, he left his nephews, Don Erskine Richardson and Seymour Richardson \$80,000, and his wife the balance. The nephews signified their willingness to avoid a will contest by relinquishing part of their claim and giving it to the widow. When the case comes up for hearing on December 20, it is understood that announcement of the terms of the settlement will be made by the lawyers.

Mrs. Richardson, a famous beauty of Santa Barbara, was married nearly three years ago, and no hint of any trouble with her husband had ever reached the outside world until

he suddenly ended his life in his apartments after a quarrel with the woman last September. The mystery of his suicide has never been fully explained.

BILLIK AGAIN GETS REPRIEVE

(United Press Leased Wire.) Springfield, Ill., Dec. 7.—Hermann Billik, the Chicago man convicted of murdering the Vzal family, was today granted a reprieve until January 29. Acting Governor Sherman signed the paper which now gives Billik nearly two months longer to live before he pays the penalty of his alleged crime.

His little daughter, Edna, who last week started an endless chain of children's letters to secure a pardon for her condemned father, has taken heart at this exhibition of executive clemency, and the agitation to save Billik's life will go on with greater hope of ultimate success.

Billik had been sentenced to die next Friday.
