TREMENDOUS PENSION GRAFT IN IRELAND

Dublin, Ireland, Dec. 9.—Wholesale frauds in the distribution of old age pensions in Ireland have caused such a scandal that, until safe guards can be placed on the system, no further pensions will be paid. It was supposed that there were only 152,000 persons, over 70 years of age in the country, entitled to the weekly pension of five shillings, but the records show that 193,000 have applied for the money and that hundreds of additional damages are coming in daily. of births was kept in Ireland, and of births was kept in Ireland, and thousands of people are not positive about their ages. But, although there is a reasonable doubt in many cases, the authorities have found others where deliberate fraud has been practiced in an effort to take advantage of the old age pension grant. Many naturalized Irish-American, returning to this country, are also adding to the confusion by grafting on the fund.
