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THE PORTLAND POSTOFFICE.

State politics are to be shaken to the bottom in the controversy over the appointment of John C. Young as postmaster at Portland.

Mr. Young is a poor man with a large family, lives in Portland, and has several of his children married there, AND ALL ARE RESPECTABLE.

He is not one of the old first families, but blew into Oregon from Salt Lake City about twenty years ago, and has never stolen anything.

STATE PROVES KEEN BUSINESS CONCERN

San Francisco, Dec. 11.—Failing to receive the necessary endorsement of the people on the proposed issue of bonds for the construction of additional docks at this port, the state board of harbor commissioners are today preparing plans for the construction of the docks with funds derived from the payment of rent in advance by lessees.

The plan of the commissioners is to obtain enough rent in advance to construct the piers and bulkheads, and a 15-year lease will be given those who advance the money, and the balance of the rental will be collected monthly. The privilege will not include free dockage and tolls for the lessees.

The proposed improvements will be made in the section of the city known as Central basin at the southern end of the water front. Bids were regularly advertised, and eight bidders responded. Their proposals were opened at a meeting of the board yesterday, and the prices for the work ranged from \$57,741 to \$93,700. The contracts will be let as soon as the advance money can be collected.

PROPOSALS FOR BIDS.

Salem, Or., Dec. 10, 1908. Information in regard to proposals for furnishing supplies for the use of the Oregon Institute for the Blind for the six months ending June 30, 1909.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Board of Trustees until 2 o'clock, Monday, December 28, 1908, and then publicly opened for furnishing for the use of the Oregon Institute for the Blind supplies as set forth in the attached form and list.

All bids must be signed by the bidder and on the blanks furnished, stating the unit price and extended for quality called for, and no bids will be considered unless on same.

If during the period of contract any excess of the article named on the within list is required, the bidder is to furnish them at contract rates.

Bids must be enclosed in envelopes endorsed "Proposals for Supplies for the Oregon Institute for the Blind," and addressed to E. T. Moores, superintendent Oregon Institute for the Blind, Salem, Oregon.

Preference will be given to articles of Oregon production or manufacture, condition, quality and price being equal.

When a particular article or brand is specifically called for, such article or brand shall have the preferential right to be considered, but bids on other articles or brands, equally good, may be considered at the discretion of the board.

The right is reserved by the board to reject any or all bids or to accept or reject any part of a bid.

All goods must be in original packages when possible, and delivered at the Oregon Institute for the Blind within ten days after the contract is awarded.
