Pitts, who he shot and killed yesterday while intoxicated. The two men were rival practitioners, and the quarrel between them grew out of the complaints which Dr. Pitts made to the landlord of their office building about Dr. Birdsong's alleged disorderly conduct and drunkenness.

MORGAN \$100,000 TO BUILD CHURCHES

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, Dec. 11.—J. Pierpont Morgan has subscribed \$100,000 to the fund for the rebuilding of Episcopal churches of San Francisco. Bishop William Ford who, with Rev. James A. Emory, arch-deacon of the diocese of California, is here raising money for the San Francisco churches, is delighted at the gift, particularly as the indications are that an additional \$100,000 will be raised among the Eastern church people who have responded generously to the bishop's appeal despite the financial stringency.

Morgan originally offered \$100,000 to the cause on the condition that an equal sum should be raised from other sources. This condition, made two years ago, he removed on Bishop Nichols' recent interview with him. His gift has been made this time without strings.

TO SUE CITY FOR BURNED CHINATOWN

(United Press Leased Wire.) Reno, Nev., Dec. 11.—The Chinese property owners and storekeepers, whose houses were burned a few months ago, when the grand jury ordered the old Chinatown district destroyed, are contemplating wholesale suits against the city, as a result of a successful suit for damages, which was won by one of their countrymen yesterday.

The demand for damages was made at the instigation of the Chinese consul of San Francisco, who made the trip to this city some time ago on purpose to confer with the aggrieved parties as to the proper method of proceeding to recover the goods and houses which they lost when the red light district was wiped out at one blow.

JEALOUS SOLDIER KILLS LIEUTENANT

(United Press Leased Wire.) Pacific Grove, Cal., Dec. 11.—Jealousy over a woman has brought Private D. C. Duke, Company B, Twentieth Infantry, to prison with two charges hanging over him, the murder of First Sergeant Edward Stanton, of the same company, and an attempt to kill the woman for whom both men quarreled.

The affray took place yesterday in a female restaurant, where Duke discovered Stanton and the woman eating together. Mad with jealousy, the soldier ran back to the Presidio for his revolver, and, on returning with it, opened fire on Stanton without warning him. Both shots took effect, and the victim of the soldier fell over dead.

Duke fired twice at the woman, but his bullets missed their mark. Then he turned to escape from the building. At the door he ran into Policeman Dorsch, who ordered him to halt. Duke raised his weapon, intending to resist, but, before he could fire again, Dorsch sent a bullet through his shoulder. Duke dropped to the ground, and was later arrested and sent to the army hospital, where, it is reported, his wound is not dangerous.

MORE HUNTING LORE FOR TEDDY'S USE

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, Dec. 11.—The Earl of Warwick, who has had several years of hunting in the regions of Africa that President Roosevelt is planning to visit, today is preparing to go to Washington for a hunting talk with the President. Warwick arrived yesterday on the White Star liner Oceanic.

The earl said today that the country selected by Roosevelt abounds in great game. With the free permission of the British government to shoot anything in sight, the President will have an opportunity to kill elephants, lions, rhinoceros, antelopes and other animals usually stringently protected by His Majesty's laws.

The earl's last hunt was in Africa two years ago, and he will proffer to the President his experiences. The territory is more accessible now than formerly, according to the earl, and the climate of Eastern Africa is fine.
