EUGENE SHOPLIFTER
(Eugene Guard.)

Mrs. Mary Sharp, whose home is at Cottage Grove, was arrested late yesterday afternoon by Chief of Police Farrington while she was at Otto's confectionery store, being suspected of shoplifting. When she was searched, a number of articles which had been reported stolen by different merchants were found on her person. She stoutly denied her guilt until the articles were identified and then she admitted that she took them. She had the following articles which she had taken: A silk scarf from F. E. Dunn's store; a remnant of silk from S. H. Friendly's store; a purse from Hill's gun store; a belt and a remnant of ribbon. Only a part of these things were found by the police, but a lady deputy searched the woman's undergarments and found the remainder. The total value of the things found is probably more than \$10. She also had \$32.50 in money in one of her stockings.

Mrs. Sharp was taken before Justice of the Peace Bryson. He sentenced her to 60 days in the county jail, but suspended sentence with the understanding that, if she is caught again the sentence will be much heavier and she will have to serve it out. She is a widow and has four children, and this had a good deal to do with the judge's leniency.

Attorney J. M. Williams says this is the same woman who was caught at shoplifting in a store at Albany several months ago. At that time she resided at Halsey.

There have been other small cases of shoplifting in several stores lately. Only last night a 13-year-old girl was caught taking an article off the counter at Hill's gun store. After taking her name and address Mr. Hill let her go, but warned her that she would be arrested if she was caught again.

ELECTRIC ROADS ARE THE BEST BOOSTERS

The best thing to build a city is a suburban electric road. Such roads bring in people who had never before been ten miles beyond their own homes and whose feet had never trod a cement sidewalk. It has been the experience of all the east that those cities which have built electric roads out into their suburbs and from there on to the little towns beyond have established themselves forever as business centers and acquired a standing and trade which for permanence and stability cannot be surpassed. During the last two years Boise has built and placed in operation sixty-two miles of suburban electric roads. The Boise Valley Railway Company has thirty miles of track in operation and is about to inaugurate a through service to Nampa. The Boise and Interurban is now maintaining a seventy-five minute service to Caldwell, a distance of thirty-two miles. These lines run down either side of the Boise valley, cost each about \$1,000,000 to construct, use sixty and 110 pound rails, have cars forty-one and forty-three feet long, with latest equipments throughout. Both do a combined freight and passenger business, they haul the farmers' products to the city and return the city's wares to the farmer. Their present lines are only a moiety of what is to come. The Interurban is now preparing to build to Pearl and through Emmett to New Plymouth and Weiser. The Boise Valley will connect Nampa and Caldwell, run from the latter to Sebroe and thence through the Deer Flat country back again to Nampa. A third electric road is projected from Boise to Gooding and from there into the great Twin Falls tracts. Some work has already been done on this line at the Gooding end and it will be completed within a reasonable time.

Boise's electric suburban system is of the very best, was built mostly with Boise money, and is helping make Boise the biggest, cleanest and best city in the Inland Empire.

GIRLS AND FACULTY QUARREL OVER BATHS
