## THE EAST 28TH STREET BRIDGE AT PORTLAND.

With all respect for the experts who examined the East 28th street bridge at Portland, that is a magnificent structure.

It is the first reinforced steel concrete bridge erected at Portland, AND IS A BEAUTIFUL PIECE OF ARCHITECTURE.

The experts find a great deal of fault with the specifications on which the bridge was built, but say the work itself is good.

Who can tell what a steel reinforced concrete bridge will carry until it has been tested? WHY NOT MAKE A REASONABLE TEST?

The people of East Portland are getting very sore at the city government, and at the mayor, for not opening the bridge.

Reinforced concrete structures for bridging are in a way an experiment, and ONE THAT WILL HAVE TO BE TRIED SOME DAY.

Why does not the city of Portland throw the bridge open and let it be tried, after a fair test of its carrying capacity?

## WHO HAS BEEN LYING ABOUT THE CREAMERY OUTPUT?

It was stated in several papers that last year the creamery product of Oregon was something like \$35,000,000.

Of course, somebody lied, and this year, to do their level best, the statisticians CANNOT DO THAT MUCH BY A LONG WAY.

So the statement is heralded that the creamery product has fallen off, we have sold too many cows, and what not has happened.

Now it is proposed to have men employed by the state and EDUCATE THE FARMERS HOW TO MAKE MORE BUTTER.

But why spend public money to boost the creamery business any more than the wheat business, the wood business, or the newspaper business?

That is a bad advertisement, and it looks like poor policy to jump on to the taxpayer to make it good.

## DR. PANTON ASSAILS THE STATE MEDICAL SCHOOL.

Dr. A. C. Panton, in an able article, over his signature, shows up the State Medical College of the University of Oregon in a bad light.

He states that the standards for admission are low, the graduates fall in either states, AND ARE THEMSELVES DISSATISFIED WITH THE SERVICE.

He charges that it is only a private corporation, run in the name of the state of Oregon, and it is not really a university college of medicine.

We have contended that those professions needed the touch of culture and THE SAME STANDARDS FOR ADMISSION REQUIRED OF UNIVERSITY STUDENTS.

We have for this been misrepresented as an enemy of the State University. The University needs the professions as much as they need it.

We had hoped that no open scandal would result before the exchange was made, but IT SEEMS THAT ABUSES ARE NOT RIGHTED IN THAT WAY.

Dr. Panton is stirring up the scandal, and good will come of it.

A university, properly speaking, CONSISTS OF FIVE COLLEGES, TEACHERS, Liberal Arts, Engineering, Law and Medicine.

The State University should have all of those at Eugene, and the standard of admission to them all should be high school graduating.
