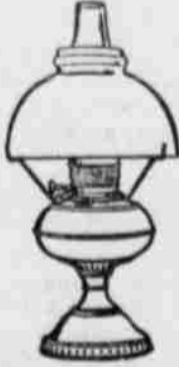

STEAMER SUNK IN ENGLISH CHANNEL

Swedish Vessel "Lindholm" Goes to Bottom with 12 Passengers.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Dover, England, Dec. 18.—The Swedish steamer Lindholm and the German steamer Frederick E. Muller collided in the British channel today. Eight people were drowned and two injured.

The Lindholm was rammed and sunk by the Muller, the whole disaster taking place in such a brief space of time that many on board were unable to save themselves, and went to the bottom with the vessel.

Eight members of the crew managed to climb into a lifeboat and push off from the doomed ship before she took her swift plunge beneath the waves. After a thrilling battle with the storm, they landed half dead from exposure.

The Muller was badly damaged in the collision. It was so crippled that it could not go ahead under its own steam. Its crew burned signals of distress, and, after a long delay, a tug was sent out to tow the injured vessel into this port.

The ill-fated steamer Lindholm was on her way to Sweden from Cardiff.

WILBUR WRIGHT WINS SPEED PRIZE

(United Press Leased Wire.) Lemans, France, Dec. 18.—Wilbur Wright, the American aviator, today broke the previous records for aeroplane flight, going 61 1/2 miles in one hour and 53 minutes and 59 seconds.

Wright's feat was performed during an aerial competition for the Michelin prize.

Wright will receive 20,000 francs prize money, unless his record is beaten before the end of this year.

REJECTED SUITOR KILLS SWEETHEART

of Dr. Agnes Hartley D'O4, AONINU Boston, Mass., Dec. 18.—Maude Hartley, the 17-year-old daughter of Dr. Agnes Hartley, of Somerville, was shot and killed today by James Harmon, a rejected lover.

The girl was about to board a street car when the unsuccessful lover made his attack on her. Drawing a revolver, he fired point blank, but the bullet flew wild, and he quickly followed it with a second. His sweetheart, fainting at the first shot, was struck by the second bullet, which penetrated her body, inflicting a wound which quickly proved fatal.

Harmond, in a frenzy of rage and grief, picked his victim up and carried the body into a grocery store nearby. To the horror-stricken clerk he shouted:

"Here she is; I've shot her." Then, turning on his heel, he fled from the place. Later, when the police closed on his tracks, he surrendered, and is now at the city prison, where a charge of murder will be placed against him.

WOMAN BEATEN IN SOCIALIST MEETING

ATTACK ROOSEVELT ON NAVY MATTER

(United Press Leased Wire.) Washington, Dec. 18.—Members of the senate are planning a further attack on the President today following the introduction in the upper house of a resolution calling upon the committee of military affairs to investigate the action of the President in ordering the withdrawal of marines from the battleships of the United States navy.

The resolution provides that the committee ascertain whether congress has not the right to provide rules for the government of the marine corps, which will bind the President, as commander-in-chief of the army and navy to continue the corps in the manner intended by law.

The resolution was referred to the committee on naval affairs at the instance of Senator Hale, because the marine corps is part of the naval branch of the United States.

Senator Rayner, who introduced the resolution, acquiesced, saying that he named the military committee were now "police, patrolmen, jailors, or something like that."

DEDICATE Y. M. C. A. TO RAILROADMEN

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, Dec. 18.—The new building of the Long Island railroad branch of the Young Men's Christian Association, built through the contributions of Mrs. Russell Sage, and the co-operation of Miss Helen Gould, was formally opened today. The building is situated in Long Island City, and is for the exclusive use of railway trainmen.

At the dedication services, which took place yesterday afternoon, Mrs. Russell Sage declared that both she and Miss Gould were "railroad women." All their sympathies belong with the trainmen; that they were glad of the opportunity to help them.

The building cost \$100,000. It is four stories high, and finished in white marble and chestnut. It contains a gymnasium, library, meeting rooms and two floors of sleeping apartments.

LANE ON FEDERAL CONTROL OF ROADS

Bound to Come, says Commissioner — Talks on Stock Issue

(United Press Leased Wire.) Chicago, Dec. 15.—Railroad men today are discussing the statement of Franklin K. Lane, interstate commerce commissioner, that soon the question of federal control of the capitalization of railroads will be the paramount issue to be fought out between the government and the railroads.

Lane spoke yesterday on the subject of Harriman, Schantz, Roosevelt and Taft, and during the speech referred to the recent decision of the supreme court that Harriman need not answer certain questions relating to his purchase or disposal of railroad stocks, as the strongest weapon yet forged in the fight of the commission.

Lane maintained that federal control was bound to come, and that already the commission had developed in the railroad officials a serious respect for the law. Lane declared that every railroad board of directors issuing stock or bonds should record in the minutes the precise purpose for which the securities are to be issued.

Lane further said that he would have the railroads held to a compliance with the purposes announced, and that if it were later discovered that sums were issued for speculative purposes the directors should be held criminally liable.

Speaking of the questions asked Mr. Harriman he said that they could not have been asked under the powers that the commission has at present. "But," he added, "those questions are bound to be asked, not of Mr. Harriman alone, but of all other railroad officials, men who have the handling of money which does not belong to them in connection with the quasi-public corporations of the public, perhaps not under the present law, but under some law that will come."

BELIEVE MURDERED GIRL HER DAUGHTER

(United Press Leased Wire.) San Jose, Cal., Dec. 18.—Mrs. Anna Rabello, of Santa Clara, believes that it is her daughter who was found murdered in a New York City lodging house last Saturday, and she has placed herself in communication with the police of that city, in the expectation of learning positively whether her fears are justified or not. The companion of the murdered young woman is reported to have told the New York police that he and the girl came from Santa Clara, and he gave his own name as Botello, which
