

NORTH SCHOOL PUPILS EXHIBIT OF DRAWINGS

There is a notable exhibition of pastel pictures in the windows of Buren & Hamilton. They are the product of a number of children in the sixth and seventh grades of the North school.

The soft tinting of blue and cream of the white bowls, placed in contrast with the red apples, give forth the faintest iridescence of rainbow colors, and are really charming.

Besides these studies of still life, are a number of landscapes illustrating the poem by H. W. Longfellow, entitled, "Afternoon in February."

The night descending, The marsh is frozen, The river dead.

Through clouds like ashes, The red sun flashes On village windows, That glimmer red.

The snow recommences, And buried fences No longer mark The way o'er the plain.

The sunset glory of the passing day, and the subtle prismatic play of color in the cold snow are admirably rendered, while the twilight

mood plays throughout the pictures. These results are most gratifying when it is remembered that drawing has just only been introduced in the schools, and the pupils did not begin to use the colors until five weeks ago.

These six pictures are part of a group of a class of fourth-grade pupils, and each boy and girl of this same group has a picture framed and ready as a holiday tribute to show their parents.

These results are not exceptional. Each of the five schools has studies as worthy of a place on a wall in some home; and the children whose eyes are opened through this work, to the beauty and the hidden meaning in nature and in things, are certainly the happier for it.

The patrons of the Salem public schools are certainly to be congratulated upon the evidences of success being attained by the new department of drawing. Incidentally the drawing teacher, Mr. Schreiber, is entitled to credit for the rapid progress being made along right lines and with enthusiasm.
