

An All-American Play.

In "Arizona," an American play by an American author and played by American players, Mr. Augustus Thomas has written what critics and public have unanimously pronounced the greatest dramatic success that America has seen in a generation. It teems with life and action, the dash of cowboy frolics, the military duties, while the atmosphere is so subtle and real that one can almost catch the breath of the sagebrush and cactus, and feel the sting of the alkali dust in one's nostrils. This Western flavor is so pungent with local color, character and force, that the whole seems more like a bit of real life from the Aravaipa valley itself than the artistic creation of the playwright's brain. An essentially human play, throbbing with romance and sentiment, there is withal a virile force in "Arizona" that imparts a thrill to every word and action, while the climaxes are surprises, wrought with skill that disarms anticipation. Having a military background, these are moments, too, when the nation's flag floats into the story with a d-ft touch of patriotism. But "Arizona" is humorous as well as human, and behind each tear lurks a laugh. In his treatment of the story, character and details Mr. Thomas has been notably realistic, even to the picturesque swear words of a young Mexican vaquero, who has absorbed his limited vocabulary of English from his crude surroundings, learning the bad with the good. The management has spared neither time, labor nor expense in giving "Arizona" a worthy presentation. The scenery and dressing of the play are not only beautiful and impressive, but wonderfully complete and accurate, even to the minutest detail, while the superb cast master a long roll of the best artists on the American stage.
