### A SAMPLE OF THE "DEMANDS."

For six months a bitter fight has been kept up by "a mere reporter" against granting an amended franchise to the street car corporation.

One of the demands is that a special car be kept standing on the track from 5 a. m. to 12, midnight, AT THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC DEPOT.

The theory seems to be that this car will leave at once upon the arrival of trains.

But the fact is IT WOULD HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL A REGULAR CAR CAME ALONG ON THE 12-MINUTE SCHEDULE ON THE YEW PARK LINE.

The car could not run into the city in any other way. Two men would be kept up nearly all night.

If it undertook to run in between the 12-minute schedule ALL CARS ON THE YEW PARK LINE WOULD HAVE TO BE HELD UP UNTIL IT WAS OUT OF THE WAY.

Is that desirable on the line that has the heaviest travel of any line in the city?

IS ANY SUCH DEMAND MADE AT ANY RAILROAD DEPOT IN PORTLAND?

Are all the people traveling on the Yew Park line to be inconvenienced to accommodate a possible few passengers from one Southern Pacific train at 10 p. m. at night?

The fact is the 12-minute schedule on the Yew Park line, with the lighted waiting room on Twelfth and Oak streets, is the best street car service to trains this city ever had.

EVERY TRAIN IS MET BETTER THAN EVER BEFORE, EXCEPT THE 5:20 A. M., AND THAT WAS NEVER MET BEFORE.

POSSIBLY THERE SHOULD BE A CAR TO MEET THE 5:20 OVERLAND TRAIN. BUT IT IS NOT DEMANDED IN OTHER CITIES.

One business man has asked The Journal to make a request for that service.

Beyond that one man's request, not a person has ever asked for any additional car service to the depot.

If any number of business men asked for a car to the 5:20 a. m. train IT IS PRESUMED THE CORPORATION WOULD PUT IT ON.

But the "demand" for a car to be kept standing at the depot from 5 a. m. to midnight is about as unbusinesslike as the rest of the "demands."

### TO PUT INSTITUTIONS IN NEW CAPITAL

(United Press Leased Wire.) Olympia, Wash., Dec. 28.—With a view to having all the public institutions of the state of Washington concentrated in one locality, J. J. Brown, the millionaire banker, of Spokane, is contemplating the introduction in the legislature of a bill providing for such a scheme.

Brown, who is a member of the board of regents of the State College at Pullman, has discussed his idea with Governor Mead and state officials. His plans provide for the purchase by the state of five or six sections of land, on which would be located a capital city. He would have this tract platted and beautified, and the ground not needed for state institutions sold to the public. Brown says that such a plan provides principally for future needs.

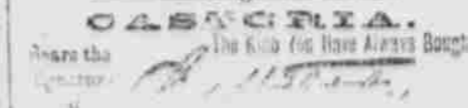

### CONGRESS STUTTERS OVER HARRIMAN'S BILL

(United Press Leased Wire.) Washington, Dec. 28.—The attorneys of E. H. Harriman are alarmed today at the possibility of failure on the part of the congressional committee on claims to allow even a portion of the remuneration asked by the railroad king for work done by his road in curbing the Colorado river where it broke its banks and threatened Imperial valley.

The claim has been reduced to \$1,988,672.97, but there is no indication of desire on the part of the legislators to take up the matter, although it merely needs authentication to insure its payment. President Roosevelt has told congress that he called upon Harriman to do the work.

Should the committee on claims fail to act soon, there is a possibility that the claim will fall of passage.

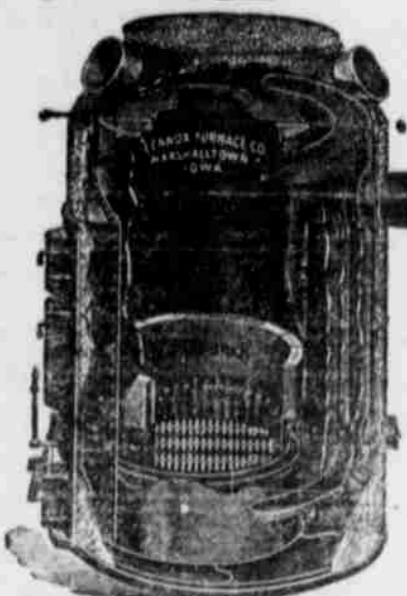
