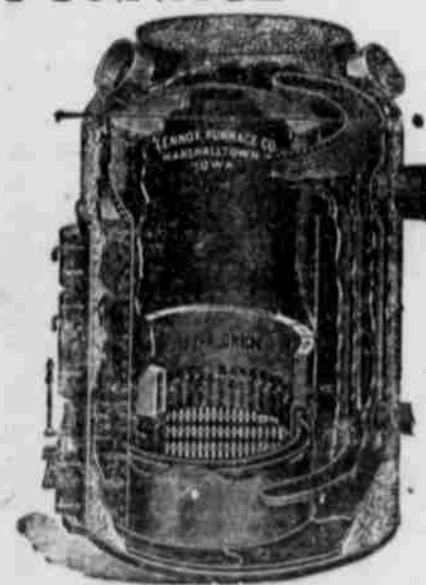

COUNCIL CHANGES PERSONELL

HOLDS HARMONIOUS SESSION

In the second conference of the city council held Monday night and on the sixth ballot Jeff Pooler was nominated over James Martin for street commissioner.

The old council then held its last session.

Petition for five-foot sidewalk on Twenty-first street, between Oak and Mill was granted.

The petition of Mrs. Frakes for aid in getting a home was rejected. Ordinances to protect trees, shrubs and plants on streets and public parks (pass), for protecting sewer pipe (pass), uniforming of police (not pass), were reported.

Monuments and permanent street grades in Englewood ordered established.

Street committee reported favorably on specifications for bitulthic pavement from Church to Twelfth streets on Court. Adopted. Grade to be established.

Asked further time on Court from Twelfth to Eighteenth; also on N. Winter, for committee to consider.

A crossing was ordered on High street, south side of Mill, to Oregon Electric depot.

Report of City Physician Miles for past year was made and adopted; referred to committee on health and police and sewage.

Battling for Lights. Petition for arc light at corner Front and State streets reported adversely; report adopted.

Petition for light at High and Division streets, granted.

Street Commissioner Martin submitted quarterly report.

Fire Chief Darr submitted annual report of fire department.

City recorder submitted report of fees and licenses collected.

On this the old council adjourned and the new members, Aldermen Hill, Hofer, Sauter and Waters, were sworn in and took their seats, Fraser, Good and Radcliffe and Waldo retiring.

The mayor then read his annual message. There was a large number of the common people present every seat being taken. The message showed that the total city revenues would be \$71,000. The message was referred to a committee of three.

Mr. Eldridge moved that Wm. Manning be re-elected as member of the park board. Carried.

Mr. Stockton made verbal report on subject of a landscape gardener for Salem parks.

Petition for laying a six-inch sewer on Union street. Referred to the sewer committee.

Petition for crosswalk at Bush and Commercial streets. Carried.

Geo. Moyer asked for use of the public streets. Referred to mayor.

Petition for alley on East Eighteenth street, to be 16 feet wide; J. A. Hewitt and others. To committee on streets.

Mr. Stockton revived the opening of Chemekota street through Mrs. Clark's property. Referred to committee on streets.

Property owners along the Bonham road petition for widening 30 foot road to 60-foot road. Referred to committee on streets.

Petition for arc light on North Winter street at bridge. To committee.

Resolution by Mr. Hofer for arc light at intersection of Rock and Lincoln streets. To committee.

Mr. Millard presented petition for an arc light at Seventeenth and A streets.

Mr. Sauter asked to have a number of crosswalks and sidewalks repaired. To committee on streets.

Mr. Hill offered resolution requiring contractors to keep up repairs on North Winter street. To street committee.

Resolutions for bitulthic pavement on Church, Liberty and Cottage streets between Court and State streets adopted.

The list of city officials as agreed on in caucus was then taken up and elected.

New Ordinances. An ordinance for \$1.50 gas was read and referred to ordinance committee.

An ordinance prohibiting minors from frequenting pool or billiard saloons was read and referred to committee on ordinances. Mr. Hofer gave notice of amendment to rules: Rule 39. Any bill, resolution or proposed amendment to, or affecting the laws of this city coming before the council shall be subscribed by the name of the alderman proposing the same. The committee adjourned.
