JEFFRIES MAY CONSENT TO FIGHT JOHNSON

(United Press Leased Wire.) Los Angeles, Cal., Jan. 5.—The probability of a match between Jack Johnson and James J. Jeffries became stronger today through the announcement that the Vernon Arena club, of which Jeffries is principal owner, is for sale.

James Coffroth, the San Francisco fight promoter, is mentioned as the possible purchaser. Ever since the Johnson-Burns fight, in which Johnson was declared the winner, enormous pressure has been brought to bear on Jeffries to get him to meet Johnson. Jack Wren, of Australia, offered Jeffries \$50,000, win, lose or drawn for such a contest, as did fight promoter McCarty of Los Angeles.

Jeffries has repeatedly denied he has any intention of re-entering the ring, but the rumor gains more strength each day. It is known that Jeffries covets this large purse.

The Wigwam theater of San Francisco made Jeffries a very tempting offer to appear in vaudeville in that city, but Jeffries refused to consider the proposition.
