PROFESSOR SAWYER MYSTERY MADE PLAIN

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Roseburg Or., Jan. 8.—Mystery surrounding the disappearance of Professor Sawyer principal of the public school at Oakland, Oregon, was partly cleared today when it was learned that he had drawn \$2000 from the bank at Oakland and took with him on his hunting trip all his clothing.

Until this discovery was made it was supposed by his wife and friends here that he had met with foul play or had been accidentally killed as he failed to return in time to open the school last Monday. Coming here five years ago Professor Sawyer married Miss Emily Devore two years ago. It is thought that he has returned to Pennsylvania from which state he came to Oakland, and no one, not even his wife, can account for his sudden disappearance. He was last seen at Red Bluff, Cal., on a hunting trip.

CHILDREN BURN AND PARENTS FREEZE

Rye Lake Wis., Jan. 8.—With four of their children burned to death and their home in ruins Chris Lee and his wife are today in a critical condition as the result of being exposed to 22 below zero weather in walking barefooted to the nearest farm house.

Lee his wife and three children escaped with their lives when their home caught fire yesterday. Four other children all boys, ranging from 8 to 16, perished. Clad only in his night clothes Lee carried the three children a quarter of a mile.

CALIFORNIA TO IMPROVE RIVERS

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Sacramento, Cal., Jan. 7.—It was announced today that Senator E. A. Boynton has been selected to introduce in the upper house the bill calling for an appropriation of \$40,000 for the improvement of the Sacramento, San Joaquin and Feather rivers in line with the recommendation of government engineers. Assemblyman A. H. Withee will perform a similar service in the assembly, the measures being introduced in both houses simultaneously.

The government has promised to give \$100,000 for the betterment of the inland waterways, providing that California shall donate a like amount for the same purpose.

KEPT WIFE IN STABLE TO SAVE HOUSE RENT

Los Angeles, Cal., Jan. 8.—Because her husband compelled her to live in a stable so that he would not have to pay house rent, Mrs. William McCormack is divorced today. The McCormacks were married in Denver in September, 1903.

The plaintiff also alleges that, while she was residing in a stall where a horse had previously been stabled, her spouse was living in comfort at his mother's home. The court heard Mrs. McCormack's tale of woe, and late yesterday granted her a decree of divorce.

Another Telephone Trick.

Some time ago a magnetic phonograph was invented which the inventor hoped to use in connection with the telephone to receive and record messages in the absence of the owner of the phone. The objection to this system was that a person calling up a number and receiving no response was not inclined to deliver his message to something so tangible as an unresponsive and apparently inanimate machine at the other end of the wire. The daily press reports a new improvement along the line in which a phonograph is provided to answer calls of telephones when the person called is out. The person before leaving will deliver a message to the phone stating when he will return where he is going, or where he may be called and this the phonograph will automatically repeat twice to each call. This it will do no matter how many calls there may be.—Scientific American

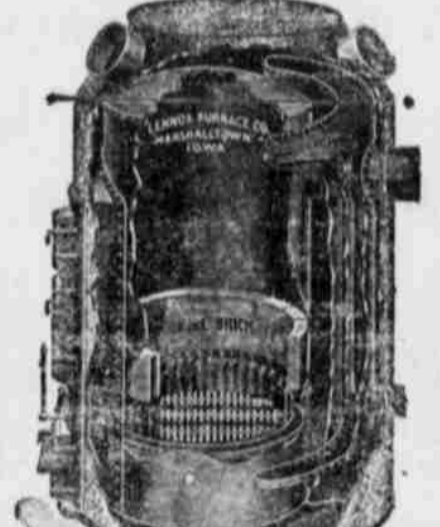
