

THE JANUARY FASHIONS.

Black Net Again Stylish— Trimmings, Beads, V Necks, Fur Toques, Seal-skin, Chin-chilla, White Fox, Black Lynx, Coats Not to Change in Shape, Hair Ornaments, The "Mary Garden Barrette."

Black net is now classed among attractive materials for evening dresses, and lined with either black, white, a dull blue, a faded pink, lavender or silver gray. Places the wearer on the topmost round of fashion. The girdle and trimmings must be black, and flat net embroidered in ribbon braid, makes a very handsome trimming, and the same ribbon braid can adorn the neck and sleeves. If not wanted for ceremonious occasions, the neck can be finished with an unlined lace yoke either of black or white net.

The Empire Shape.
This is the style readily made at home, as there is no special fit re-

quired. The present moment is the fur toque. This can either be entirely composed of fur or can have a draped crown of velvet, heavy satin or soft felt. These toques are rather large, setting well down over the head. The only trimming consists of fur heads or tails or perhaps a single big rose or a bunch of gardenias or again it may be adorned in military fashion with an upstanding bunch of aigrettes. To have the fur toque, neck scarf and muff in black lynx is the very latest fad, though both white and pointed fox are also used for the purpose.

Had not it been for the slight covering of snow, the slough would have afforded some of the best skating in years, but it is both very rough and dangerous.

The spangles are placed (in graduated size) one above the other which gives a button-like appearance. An especial advantage in a black net dress is that it is useful during the entire year. Beads have superseded spangles to a considerable extent and vines of colored passementerie leaves connected by festoons of gilt beads, are brought out to finish the edge of low-neck waists. A V cut very low at back and front, and the square neck effect, are the two prevailing styles, of course over a tucked mousseline yoke.

Hair Ornaments.

Prominent among these is the "Juliet cap" or as some writers term it, the Greek fillet, made of imitation pearls with a white aigrette at the side. Then there are half-circles of satin ribbon in various colors, wound on a large wire, with a narrow ribbon bow at each end or sometimes a large white rose, sparkling with dew drops is substituted at one end. Half circles of flowers made of gold or silver tinsel, holly sprays, butterflies, small flowers of all kinds aigrettes or ostrich tips afford an extended choice. The fashionable barrette is very large, extending out under the low coiffure and partly supporting it. These are called after the famous opera singer, "Mary Garden barrettes" as she introduced them in the new opera "Thaïs."
