

CALHOUN TRIAL BEGINS IN 'FRISCO

(United Press Leased Wire.)
San Francisco Cal., Jan. 13.—Patrick Calhoun, president of the United Railways, flanked by his corps of attorneys, faced Judge Lawler Tuesday at the opening session of his trial, on a charge of offering a bribe of \$4000 to Supervisor Fred P. Nicholas.

As the district attorney, Francis J. Heney, standing at the prosecution's desk for the first time since he was shot down during the trial of Abraham Ruef, began his preliminary motions of what promises to be the most renowned trial in the history of California courts.

Twenty months have elapsed since Calhoun was first indicted on charges of offering bribes to the men who composed the boodling board of supervisors under former Mayor Schmitz. During that time three supplemental indictments were returned against the traction magnate, and on one of them he now faces the bar of justice.

The court's ban has been placed on delays. The prosecution has announced that no further continuances will be asked, and the defense has professed itself as ready for trial for several months.

Calhoun in his desire for a speedy hearing, has instructed his attorneys to lay aside all technicalities.

Attorneys predict that it will take but two weeks to secure a jury, and but another two weeks to put in all the evidence. Should this be the case, the hearing will not equal in length the Ruef trial, which took four months to convict the fallen city boss.

Heney arrived last night from the East. The prosecutor was greeted by a large crowd at the ferry building, in which were many friends and foes of the graft prosecution. Heney was surrounded by a bodyguard of police. He appeared in excellent health and spoke but a few words. He said:

"I am not going to make a speech, but I want to say just enough to show you that I am still able to talk loud enough to convict everyone of the grafters before I quit."

District Attorney Langdon announced today that all the other graft trials will be rushed. Attorney A. S. Newburg is now on trial on a charge of offering a bribe to a prospective Ruef juror. M. W. Coffey is first of the boodling supervisors to face trial for receiving a bribe. Coffey's immunity was withdrawn by the prosecution because he refused to testify in one of the graft trials.

Langdon says that the fight trust men, Eddie Graney, Willis Britt and James Coffroth, are next in order, and that former Chief of Police Jeremiah Dinan, charged with perjury, and United Railroads Attorneys Porter Ashe and Luther Browne, charged with kidnaping Fremont Older, of the Bulletin an afternoon paper, will soon be placed on trial.

With Heney at the prosecution's table were seated District Attorney William Langdon and Assistant District Attorney John O'Gara. For Calhoun appeared Attorney A. A. Moore, his son, Stanley Moore, and former District Attorney Lewis F. Byington.

Calhoun, preceded by Thomas Gibson, head of the United Railroads secret service, walked composedly up the main aisle. He was accompanied by Thornwell Mullally. Calhoun nodded to the various newspaper men assembled, and talked in a low voice with his attorneys. Shortly afterward Heney entered the court room. He was accompanied by Detectives Foley and McCarthy of Burn's bodyguard.

Judge Lawler began the examination of taleamen who were in court to present legal excuses for not serving on the jury. While the weeding out process was going on Attorney William A. Abbott of the United Railways, appeared at the Calhoun counsel table. It was learned that Attorney Earl Rogers, of Los Angeles, will be associated with the defense. He arrived in the city today, but was not in the court room.

A Good Skating Pond—

Some of the best skating discovered in this vicinity so far, lies adjacent to the mouth of Mill creek on the island side of the slough. There are several small inlets there, and quite a large pond also. The larger of the inlets is covered with about two or three inches of ice and owing to the trees growing closely around it, the surface froze smooth as glass. The trees also protect it from being covered with snow. About two blocks square is the area of the skating pond, and there is no danger from breaking through, as the water is only two feet deep in the deepest part. In order to reach this small lake, one must follow the ice from the foot of Bellevue street across the little strait at that point, and then follow the skate lines along the edges of the willows, which will lead to the best skating.


