

FINCH FINDS FAULT WITH MANNER OF TRIAL

A motion to stay the execution of James A. Finch, the condemned murderer of Attorney Ralph E. Fisher, and to set aside the judgment, was filed in the circuit court yesterday morning.

Finch was the victim of the jury, was contrary to the weight of the evidence, and against the law. The court had no jurisdiction, he says, to impose sentence or to receive the verdict, because the trial was, in essence, a continuation of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States constitution.

HAT FACTORIES CUT OUT UNION LABELS

New York, Jan. 15.—Seventy-hat factories, employing approximately 25,000 persons, will be affected by a decision of the Associated Hat Manufacturers, promulgated today.

Charles Menckels, president of the Associated Hat Manufacturers, stated that the union label was a violation of the contract made with the employees.

Seven Hundred Go Out

South Norwalk, Conn., Jan. 15.—Seven hundred hat makers are out on strike here today, as the result of the discontinuance of the union label by the Associated Hat Manufacturers.

Arnold Turner, treasurer of the national organization of hat manufacturers, at Danbury, Conn., this afternoon stated:

Every concern connected with the association was represented, either personally or by proxy. There is a clause in our agreement with the union which provides there shall be no strike while the settlement of any question involving the employee is pending.

STOCK MARKET IS VERY QUIET

New York, Jan. 15.—Speculation in the stock market today was tame of significance. After a rather colorful opening, the standard securities made a fractional uptick. After the first hour, however, the volume of business declined materially, and trading became needle-like in its narrowness.

CANADIAN TRAIN GOES INTO THE LAKE

(United Press Landed Wire.) Vancouver, B. C., Jan. 15.—Carrying 24 engineers and firemen with it, the locomotive of the west-bound Canadian Pacific freight train ran into a snow slide at Three Valley Lake at full speed yesterday, leaving the rails, jumped over the embankment and plunged into the lake. It is presumed that both men were pinned in the cab of the engine, and were crushed and were drowned. Three Valley Lake is just west of Chin William station.

Information as to the identity of the two men killed is being withheld by the authorities, pending the receipt of advice which will confirm beyond doubt that reported deaths. It is reported, however, that Goughlin was the engineer, but the identity of the fireman cannot be learned.

Several freight cars immediately behind the engine were derailed, but did not fall over the embankment. The slide is reported as being from 25 to 50 feet wide, and very large in volume. It was caused by the comparatively mild weather of the past two days, and no train has arrived in Vancouver for that period.

SUPPLY SHIP CELTIC AT GIBRALTAR

(United Press Landed Wire.) Washington, Jan. 15.—The supply ship Celtic, with 1,200,000 naval rations aboard for the earthquake victims in Southern Italy, arrived at Gibraltar, according to dispatches received by the navy department today. The Celtic has been ordered to Naples immediately. The Celtic was at New York taking on supplies for the American half-breed feet at the time of the Italian disaster, and was ordered to proceed to Italy to dispense its cargo for the benefit of the earthquake victims by President Roosevelt.
